

Notes from Fr. PJ

Dear Friends in Christ,

Peace!

Some of us like to eat meat, while some of us prefer fish. Some of us have a big taste for seafood, while some of us find steak (medium rare at that) mouth-watering. Some are vegetarians, while some don't eat anything that walks, swims, waddles, or squiggles. That is the good thing about the world the good Lord created. We are given the freedom to choose, to will, to decide, and to want what we like or who to love. De gustibus non disputandum, as the old Latin saying goes. That means, in a variant way, matters of taste are not matters of dispute.



When Jesus, our saving Lord, decided to have his circle of apostles, as reflected in this weekend's Gospel reading, the people He chose were fishermen. This was not a matter of taste but a matter of choice. Why did He choose fishermen during his time? Because they were primarily patient.

Fishermen are known to be patient. They could wait for long hours to have a catch of fish, sometimes even in the cold of the night, sometimes even in the torturing heat in the middle of the ocean. Patience, whose root word is pax, meaning peace, is the eldest offspring of love. St. Paul wrote in his letter to the Corinthians about love that love is patient. That is first and foremost. If we are in love, we should necessarily be patient with our beloved. If we love a person, that means we need to be patient with that person in more ways and manners than one. Why? Because love is patient.

The test of love happens when our patience gets tested more by people we love, especially in our own family circle. That is the irony. But, it is when we have more patience with people we love that we can just hope and pray that they would mirror just the kind of patience we have towards them. As our good Lord was patient with the chosen Twelve, most of them fishermen, so would they also be with the people they would encounter.

That is the whole point of the Good News—to mirror our Lord in His actions, to bear and share what Jesus has exemplified in His life.

Thus, the apostles had to be patient while they were ignored, rebuffed, and insulted. The apostles had to be patient when they were criticized for speaking about Jesus. The apostles had to be patient with people who did not want to hear about the Truth. By witnessing the love of Jesus, these same disciples must have learned also how to love, for by then, they had remained patient with all the criticisms, insults, and false insinuations hurled against them. When they preached about the Messiah's resurrection, patience had already been embedded in their DNA.

In this day and age, during our time, we all could side with Jesus in making the right choice and decision. He made the right choice with the men he chose to be his apostles. The call and the challenge of our times and of our lives, is the virtue and gift of patience.

Just wait. Be patient. We might be in for a long haul, but there is a Big Catch towards the end — Someone we've been hoping for, Someone we've been praying to, Someone who has always been patient with us — Jesus, our Saving Lord.
