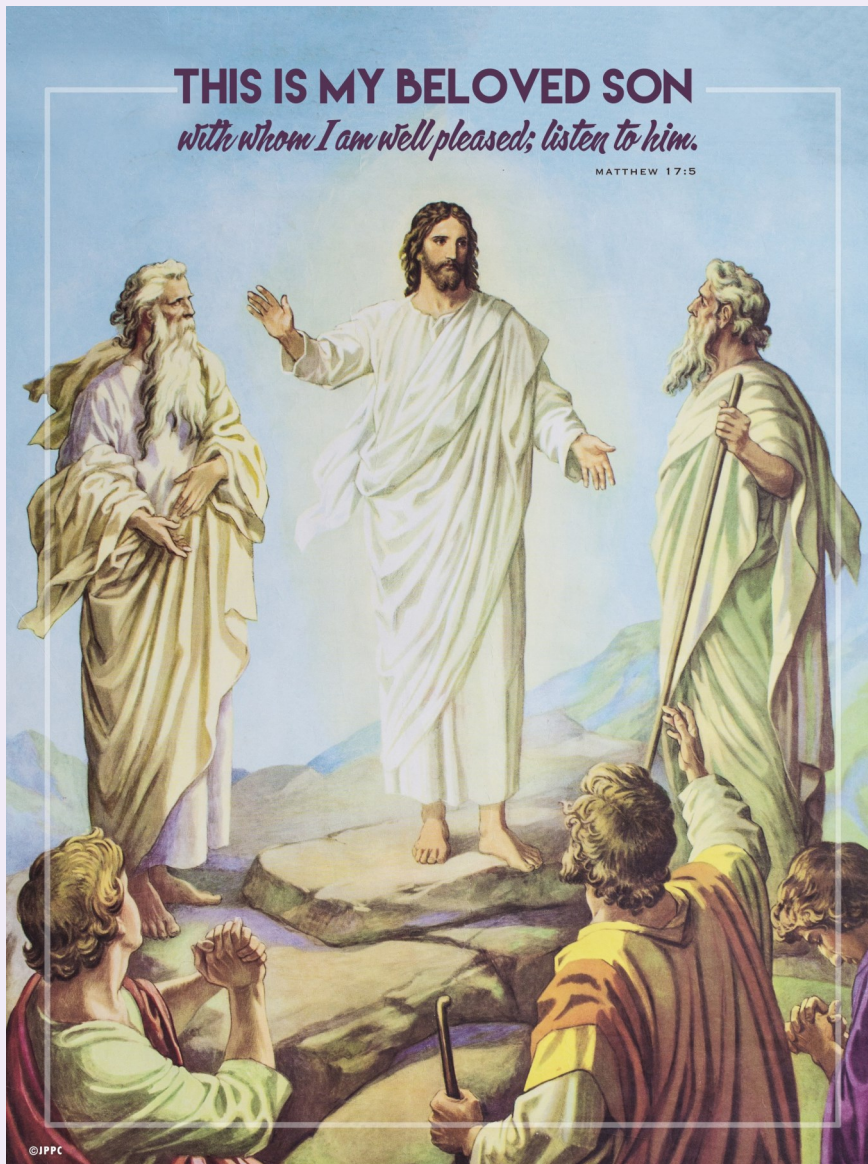

Greetings from Father PJ in Chile

Dear Friends in Christ,
Peace and Joy from Chile!

There is always a first. This time I got my first Chilean ash, for lack of a better term, on my forehead. Lent has just begun.

Fr. Freddy, an SVD Priest originally from India and the Mass celebrant, imposed the ashes. There were only six of us, priests, at their small chapel. The humidity was slightly high, so we turned on the AC.

Actually, there were so many firsts in this experience. It was my first time celebrating Ash Wednesday outside a parish (this was in a religious order house). It was my first time not helping impose the ashes (I am of no help and read further on why), and it was my first time receiving them late in the day—half past seven in the evening (good timing though for fasting and abstinence).

Chileans are not into ashes, I see. Perhaps, they are reminded of the month-long wildfires that have been burning across their arid regions. Or maybe, they are just savoring the last days of their summer vacation this February.

Mardi Gras and Carnival celebrations might also be of little interest. I also learned yesterday since what is there to celebrate when they are just winding down with their short break.

Thus, the clergy here has to do some tweaking with their days of the imposition. If Catholics didn't get the ashes on the actual day, Ash Wednesday, they could have them on the upcoming weekend. So, they have Ash Saturday and Ash Sunday—which is again another first for me to experience.

There is little difference, though, between the Chilean ash and the ashes I had previously. Same dirt, the same smudge, and the same image of the cross.

Same message, too. It is a basic one.

We will go back to earth—no exceptions (for no one has come back again from death to life except Jesus). And when the untimely becomes timely, we will meet our Maker.

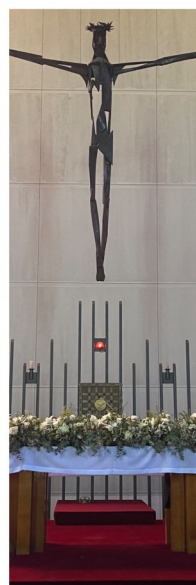
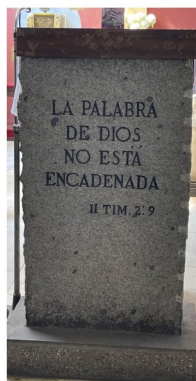
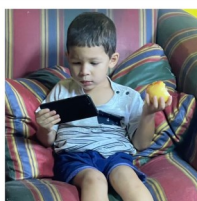
By then, I doubt whether our Lord will ask me whether I had a Chilean ash on my forehead at one point in my life.

I believe He will ask me how I lived my life, His gift, and how I helped others to live theirs, too. That hopefully would be the gift I'll bring to Him.

The 40 Days of Lent

Did you ever wonder why Lent is 40 days in length (not counting the Sundays of Lent)?

The number forty appears many times in the Bible:

- Forty days and nights of rain during the flood
- Moses lived forty years in Egypt
- The Jews journeyed through the desert for forty years to the Promised Land
- Jonah preached forty days to Nineveh
- The prophet Ezekiel laid on his right side for forty days to symbolize the sins of Judah
- Elijah fasted for forty days on Mount Horeb
- Goliath taunted Israel for forty days
- Jesus fasted in the desert forty days

The number 40 is a symbolic number in Scripture, which signifies completion or fullness of time. It indicates a complete period of time that transitions to another period of time. After each forty days or years listed above, a great event occurs, or a huge change takes place.

During Lent, we remember that Jesus fasted in the desert for 40 days to prepare Himself for His mission, which would conclude with His Passion, Death, and Resurrection.

We fast for the 40 days of Lent to prepare our hearts for the greatest feast of all, Easter – the Resurrection of Jesus.

When we repent of our sins by fasting, praying, and giving alms, we are also preparing for our own future death and resurrection to new life with Him in Heaven.
