




Letter From Fr. PJ

Dear Friends in Christ.

Peace and all good to you and your loved ones!

First a story: There were two gentlemen once who were travelling on a plane and seated next to each other. One turned to the other and asked, "What do you do?" The gentleman replied, "I am a priest." "Oh," said the first man, "I don't believe in that religious stuff. It is for kids, you know—'Jesus loves me this I know, for the Bible tells me so...: The priest politely laughed and asked the other man what he did for a living. "I am an astronomer," said the first man. "Oh, that stuff," said the priest, "I thought it was just for kids, you know—'Twinkle, twinkle, little star..."



Most of us, if not all, have met skeptics at one time or another in our lives. Nicodemus, the Pharisee we hear in this Sunday's Gospel reading, might be one of those. He went to see Jesus at night in an attempt to figure him out. What our Lord said to Him brought Him to realize what Jesus did to Him, and who Jesus is for you and me in our times.

Basically, as Jesus said in the oft-quoted passage, John 3:16 explains it all. So, here it goes:

God The greatest Lover
So loved The greatest degree
The world The greatest company
That he gave The greatest act
His Only Son The greatest Gift

That whoever Believes The greatest opportunity
In Him The greatest attraction
Shall not perish But The greatest difference
Have The greatest certainty
Eternal Life The greatest possession

What greater act is there than giving your Only Son for the forgiveness of sins? What greater certainty is that than being promised heaven? What greater attraction is there than Jesus, our God and Savior? But, what greater obstacle is there than not believing in Him, not obeying His commands, and not following through with our actions?

Though Nicodemus met Jesus at night, it probably felt like day, when Jesus told Him the answer to his question. Jesus is the Answer. He is the greatest Gift given by the greatest Lover so that we attain eternal life, the greatest possession ever.

40 DAYS FOR LIFE

The 40 Days for Life is a campaign of prayer and fasting for an end to abortion here in America, from February 17 to March 28. Since its inception in 2007, 18,003 babies have been saved, 211 abortion workers have guit, and 107 abortion centers have closed. 40 Days for Life also involves prayerful, peaceful witnessing in front of an abortion clinic. People are asked to simply stand (or walk) and say the Rosary or other prayers for one hour. Here in Monmouth, the site is the Planned Parenthood facility at 69 E. Newman Springs Rd in Shrewsbury. We have been asked to staff each Wednesday from February 17 to March 28. That would be 6 Wednesdays, Feb 17, Feb 24, March 3, 10, 17, and 24. The hours are from 8 AM to 6 PM.
