Letter From Fr. PJ

Dear Friends in Christ,

Peace and Joy to you and your loved ones!

I know, I know. This is what some of us do when we arrive a little bit earlier in Church on weekends. With our masks still on (the other trifecta of the pandemic), we sanitize our hands coming in, then get a cleaning wipe or two as we find our way to our favorite pew (while also hoping that it was not cordoned, or unoccupied). Then, we either kneel or bow our heads in prayer.

And then, some, just a little some of us, open the bulletin for a quick perusal of what is happening or what Fr. PJ wrote. Just like today. See, I see you nodding your head. I also see your smile.

The Holy Spirit, the third Person of the Blessed Trinity, is our main

Connector. Pentecost, which we celebrate this weekend, is a great reminder of our

connection (also read: a different, out-of-this-world relationship). It gave us unity as a Church. From a symbolical diversity of language brought by the Tower of Babel, we become united. There is oneness as a Church family and part of one community. We became **A** church at Pentecost. It is our birthday.

Other than connection, the basic theme of Pentecost is communication. Language was the barrier that prevented us from understanding each other. But the Spirit, the Holy Spirit, our Advocate made us see and look at each other through our hearts, no longer through tongues, color, sex, status and race. They now call us Christians, because we are followers of the Christ. Catholics, they now call us, because we are all invited to be in one fold, to be universal, to be one.

So, here is a story while we are waiting for the Mass to begin.

Several years ago in a mountain village in Europe, a wealthy nobleman wondered what kind of legacy he should leave to his townspeople. He made a wise decision by building them a church. No one was permitted to see the plans of the inside of the church until it was finished. At its grand opening, the people gathered and marveled at the beauty of the new church. Everything had been thought of and included. It was a masterpiece.

But then someone said, "Wait a minute! Where are the lamps?" It is really quite dark in here. How will the church be lighted?" The nobleman then pointed to some brackets in the walls, and then he gave each family a lamp, which they were to bring with them each time they came to worship.

"Each time you are here," the nobleman said, "the place where you are seated will be lighted. Each time you are not here, that place will be dark. This is to remind you that whenever you fail to come to Church, some part of God's house will be dark."

Dear friend, thank you for continually lighting up the Church of St. Veronica's. With your presence, our house of worship will never go dark. With God's presence, it will always be lit.

Oooops, one more fervorino. Today is the birthday of the Church. Our question now is: What if every member of our Church supported the church just as you do? What kind of church would we have? What if every single member served the church, attended the church, loved the church and gave to the church exactly as you do? What kind of church would we be?

Pentecost Reflection

The gift of Pentecost - the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, and the spiritual gifts and blessings of God - are made possible through the death, resurrection, and ascension of the Lord Jesus. After his resurrection Jesus "breathed" on his disciples and gave them the Holy Spirit. Just as God breathed life into Adam, so the gift of the Holy Spirit is an impartation of "new life" for his people. With the gift of the Holy Spirit a new creation begins. God recreates us for his glory. Jesus' gift of peace to his disciples was more than an absence of trouble. His peace included the forgiveness of sins and the fullness of everything good. Do you want power to live a faith-filled life as a disciple of Jesus? Ask the Father to fill you with the power of his Holy Spirit (Luke 11:13).

Basil the Great (329-379 AD), an early church father, explains the role of the Holy Spirit in our lives: "The Spirit restores paradise to us and the way to heaven and adoption as children of God; he instills confidence that we may call God truly Father and grants us the grace of Christ to be children of the light and to enjoy eternal glory. In a word, he bestows the fullness of blessings in this world and the next; for we may contemplate now in the mirror of faith the promised things we shall someday enjoy. If this is the foretaste, what must the reality be? If these are the first fruits, what must be the harvest?" (From the treatise by Basil on The Holy Spirit)

The Lord Jesus offers each one of us the gift and power of his Holy Spirit. He wants to make our faith strong, give us hope that endures, and a love that never grows cold. He never refuses to give his Spirit to those who ask with expectant faith. Jesus instructed his disciples to ask confidently for the gift of the Spirit: "If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!" (Luke 11:13). Do you thirst for God and for the abundant life he offers through the gift of his Spirit?

Prayer: Lord Jesus, I thank you for the gift of Pentecost and for the new life you offer in the Holy Spirit. Fill me with your Holy Spirit and set my heart ablaze with the fire of your love that I may serve you in joy and freedom
