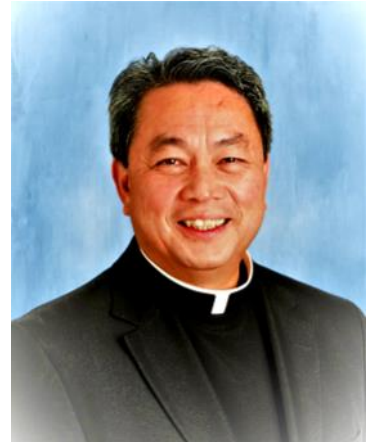
Letter From Fr. PJ

Dear Friends in Christ,

Blessings of Peace and Joy in your hearts!

There is no easy way to define, describe, explain and expound on the Trinity. However, there is something we all know: the way to God is the way to happiness and peace. What or Who brings us to God can be the very same things or people (even ideas) that can make us happy and have peace in our hearts. Being with God is perfect happiness. Time and space are inconsequential when we speak about union with God.

It is like that with people who are deeply in love with their beloved. Time passes by so quickly that its passing is rarely noticed. Space provides no limit as lovers get more intimate, that just being together goes beyond physical and measurable dimensions.



What then could make us happy? To be happy, I dare say, that we need to have a Someone in our lives. That someone could be somebody where we find a lot of commonality. Differences divide, having common desires, wants and needs unites. Having a Someone in our lives is just the first phase. In order to experience life in its happier moments, we need to be in a relationship with that Someone. Relationship defines what we are to each other.

Now, because we are related more by faith than by blood, we are exemplified more by commitment than involvement. Jesus was not just involved with us. He committed himself for us. If religion is a relationship of faith and understanding, then the only way to happiness, the only way to holiness, the only way to God is through a relationship of individuals and persons based on love.

When we fall in love, when we are in love, whenever we share love, we become one with God who created us. Whenever we fall out of love and whenever we do not share love, we become separated from the God who died for us.

It is an obvious reality, I think. There is no happiness in being alone because we are not meant to be alone. Whenever somebody is turned down and rejected, there is a betrayal of the God who is ever abiding and embracing. Whenever somebody feels isolated and excluded, there is a betrayal of the God who is ever present and accepting. And, whenever somebody feels alone and helpless, there is a betrayal of a God, who is ever compassionate and understanding.

Our good Lord did not go through the phases in understanding us, but He was in each of the three phases of our lives. We are that someone God the Father created. We are that someone God the Son brought to a new kind of relationship. And, we are that someone God the Spirit is continually protecting and guiding, uniting us to the communion of Persons we still cannot fully understand,

The Most Holy Trinity.
