

Letter From Fr. PJ

Dear Friends in Christ,

May you have the peace and joy in your hearts and your homes!

My aim is to keep this letter simple. I think that simplicity in life, not its complications and complexities, is the key to holiness. Peace is nurtured in our hearts once grown from our simple lives.

Jesus made it very simple for us who hunger for him and eternal life—"Eat my body." And for those who thirst for Him—"Drink my blood." God is not complicated, you see. God is simple. If we have to engage and commit ourselves to God, we only need to be simple. Heavy burden and loads of complexities bear us down. Why do we have to complicate simple things? Why make a big thing out of maybe, a little one? What else do we really need when we already have more than what we truly want?



Most great leaders throughout the history of the world, most great writers and thinkers in learning, education and formation have agreed that usually the simplest solution is the best solution.

A truck got stuck under an underpass one day. First, they brought in the highway department, who immediately called an engineer. The engineer started figuring out and thought of jacking the underpass up, so the truck could be free without damage. A boy passing by called the attention of the engineer, "Hey Mister!" He chased him off, "Go away kid. I still have to figure this out. I have no time for you."

The engineer's plans were too elaborate and expensive. So they called a heavy equipment operator, who thought of digging out the road under the truck with a backhoe. The truck could be freed without damage, or so he thought. The boy called the attention of the operator, "Hey, Mister!" He chased him off, "Go away kid. I still have this gigantic thing to do."

Finally, the boy went to the truck driver, "Hey, Mister." The truck driver, who felt sorry for the boy being ignored so badly, sighed and said, "What now, boy?"

The boy said, "Mister, we can free up the truck in this underpass. Just let the air out of the tires!"

The Body and Blood of Christ is the solution to most, if not all, of our problems. What we now possess we need to let go. Jesus did. What we now have in life is nothing compared to what we will have in the next. Every brokenness needs healing. We may have been wounded in the past. Our dark and hidden secrets, the skeletons in our closets may have hindered us from moving forward. Bring them to our Lord Jesus. Take them to Christ. The Body of Christ heals what was and is broken.

When we take Jesus in our hearts and carry him in our lives with the grace of His Body and Blood in the Eucharist, we are reminded of the promise He made. So, when life gets complicated, when we encounter problems and difficulties that no solution seems to be at hand, when trouble and hardships meet us unexpectedly along the way, recall what Jesus said and did.

Here is my Body. Take it and eat it. Here is my Blood. Drink it and share it. And when you do these things I commanded you to do, know that I am with you always. I will never abandon you.
