Letter From Fr. PJ

Dear Friends in Christ,

Peace and Joy to you and your loved ones!

A fellow walked into a doctor's office and the receptionist asked him what he had. He said, "Shingles." So, she took down his name, address, medical insurance number and told him to have a seat. A few minutes later, a nurse's aide came out and asked him what he had. He said, "Shingles." So, she took down his height, weight, a complete medical history and told him to wait in the examination room. Ten minutes later, a nurse came in and asked him what he had. He said, "Shingles." So she gave him a blood test, a blood pressure test, an electrocardiogram, told him to take off all his clothes and wait for the doctor.



Fifteen minutes later, the doctor came and asked him what he had. He said, "Shingles." The doctor asked, "Where?" He said, "Outside in the truck. Where do you want them?"

A single word may have different meaning. Jairus and the woman with the hemorrhage in this weekend's Gospel may or may not have met, but a single word unites them both—and that is, Faith.

Bleeding for twelve long years, the woman had suffered much. True and genuine faith can be seen when one has acknowledged God's love and goodness during times of pain and uncleanness, when years of praying coming from her lips may have just brought out nothing. So, when she heard about Jesus, she said, "If I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured."

Touching Jesus was a decision that made the difference. She touched him with true faith in her heart. No suffering, no pain, no uncleanness, no bitterness and no misery could equal faith in the woman's heart, when she touched Jesus. "Who touched me?" our Lord asked. In fear and trembling, she approached Him and then Jesus said, "Go in peace and be cured from your affliction."

You see, God gives us always more than what we need. Healing her was just a part. Restoring her to the faith community and strengthening her faith were some of the rest. The significant part was giving back her life.

Life is about living for another. A different kind of a relationship was established when the woman touched Jesus. When we are in pain and need comfort, we cannot hug ourselves or embrace ourselves. When we are in grief and need to be consoled, we cannot cry on our own shoulders. We need another person. We need an extraordinary kind of Person, Jesus the Christ, in order to be touched, to be healed, to be brought anew to a different kind of life—the Christian way.

When we are faced with difficulties, our deepest need comes when we help one another battle our problems and embrace our pains. Our hunger does not end when we are satisfied with the food we eat, but when we share what we have, when we give more from what we get. With faith as our point of unity, our deepest longing is not that we are healed and cured from a disease (perhaps, in our times, Covid-19). Rather, it is the sharing in each other's pains, fears and frustrations. St. Cyril of Alexandria wrote that, "by nature each one of us is enclosed in his own personality, but supernaturally, we are all one."

Faith is the strong bond that united Jairus, the synagogue official, to the woman afflicted with hemorrhage. Through faith, we share in our pains and celebrate in our joys. Without faith, we will always be defeated by fear; with faith, fear is conquered.

"Have faith!" Jesus says to us today. Faith takes away our pains and our bleedings. Faith shows us our future, as it has directed our past. And yes, faith can lead us to life eternal, shingles or no shingles.
