

Notes from Fr PJ

Dear Friends in Christ,

Peace and Joy to you and your family!

We had a new reader at Mass before in one of my previous parishes. Primarily, it could be nerve-wracking to speak publicly before an attentive audience, as we all know. So, this new reader was so nervous that at the end of the reading, she proclaimed in a quivering voice, "This is the end of the world." And the people replied. "Thanks be to God!"

Of course, we know that she should have said, "The Word of the Lord." But, as a Christian community we are trained to be forgiving and caring, so the people just replied, "Thanks be to God" and rightly so.

What is there to thank about "The Word of the Lord?" Plenty, we say. The Lord's words, God's words can do things that our words cannot do.

First, God's words describe things in truth and reality. Ours could describe things clouded by judgment, experience and conviction. Secondly, God's words command. They make things happen, just as we have read in the Bible. "Let there be light," God said in the Book of Genesis. And there was light. Thirdly, the words of God command miracles and miraculous deeds. God commands the water turning into wine in Cana, just as He commanded us to do things in His memory through the Mass with the wine changed into His Blood and the bread into His Body. Fourth, God's words were given to us in The Book, which is the Holy Bible. This is a good segue for me to remind you to read regularly and studiously the Bible.

Basic Instruction Before Leaving Earth. B.I.B.L.E. That is what some people make of the word Bible.

And finally, God's Word is Jesus, our Lord. With Jesus our Lord, we would run out of a million reasons to thank our Almighty Father.

Thus, our First Reading this weekend from the Prophet Isaiah says, "my word shall not return to me void." Please make it happen in our lives that the word coming forth from the mouth of God shall do His will, achieving the end for which God sent it.







Diocesan Retired, Elderly & Infirmed Priests Fund

An annual fund was established by Bishop O'Connell to benefit the retired, elderly and infirm priests in the Trenton Diocese. The collection will be taken July 22 & 23 coinciding with the 3rd World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly.

Bishop O'Connell explained the need: "Twenty-five years ago, there were 12 retired priests in the Diocese of Trenton. Today there are 75. Five years from now, there will be over 100 retired priests here. We face a shortage of resources to provide for the basic needs of this quickly growing group." (July 11, 2022 message)

The Bishop noted that proceeds of the fund will be used for

1) on going operations of Villa Vianney, the Diocese's rent retirement facility in Lawrenceville; 2) to look for new properties that can be developed to accommodate the greater number of retired priests, and 3) to provide adequate nursing care for those priests who require it.



Decree of the Apostolic Penitentiary on the granting of Plenary Indulgence on the occasion of the Third World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, (message 05.07.2023)

DECREE

The Apostolic Penitentiary, in order to increase the devotion of the faithful and procure the salvation of souls, by virtue of the faculties attributed to it by the Supreme Pontiff Francis, Pope by Divine Providence, accepting the recent request presented by the Most Eminent Cardinal of the Holy Roman Church Kevin Joseph Farrell, Prefect of the Dicastery for the Laity, Family and Life, on the occasion of the Third World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, already instituted by the Supreme Pontiff on the fourth Sunday of the month of July and which this year will be held on the theme "His mercy is from age to age" (*Lk* 1:50) graciously grants from the heavenly treasures of the Church the Plenary Indulgence, under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer according to the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff) to grandparents, the elderly and all the faithful who, motivated by a true spirit of penance and charity, participate on 23 July 2023, on the occasion of the Third World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, at the solemn celebration over which the Most Holy Father Francis will preside in the Vatican Papal Basilica, or at the various functions that will be held throughout the world, a Plenary Indulgence that may also be applied as a suffrage to the souls in Purgatory.

This Court of Mercy also grants the Plenary Indulgence on this same day to the faithful who devote adequate time to visiting, in person or virtually, through the communications media, their elderly brothers and sisters in need or in difficulty (such as the sick, the abandoned, the disabled...). The Plenary Indulgence may also be granted, provided that they free themselves from any sin and intend to fulfill the three usual conditions as soon as possible, to the sick elderly and to all those who, unable to leave their homes for a serious reason, will unite spiritually with the sacred services of World Youth Day, offering to the Merciful God their prayers, their sorrows and the sufferings of their lives, especially while the words of the Supreme Pontiff and the various celebrations are broadcast through the media. In order, therefore, that this opportunity to obtain divine grace through the power of the Keys of the Church may be more easily realized through pastoral charity, this Penitentiary firmly

requests priests, equipped with the appropriate faculties to hear confessions, to make themselves available, with a ready and generous spirit, for the celebration of the Sacrament of Penance.

This Decree is valid for the Third World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, notwithstanding any provision to the contrary. Given in Rome, at the Seat of the Apostolic Penitentiary, on 15 June 2023.
