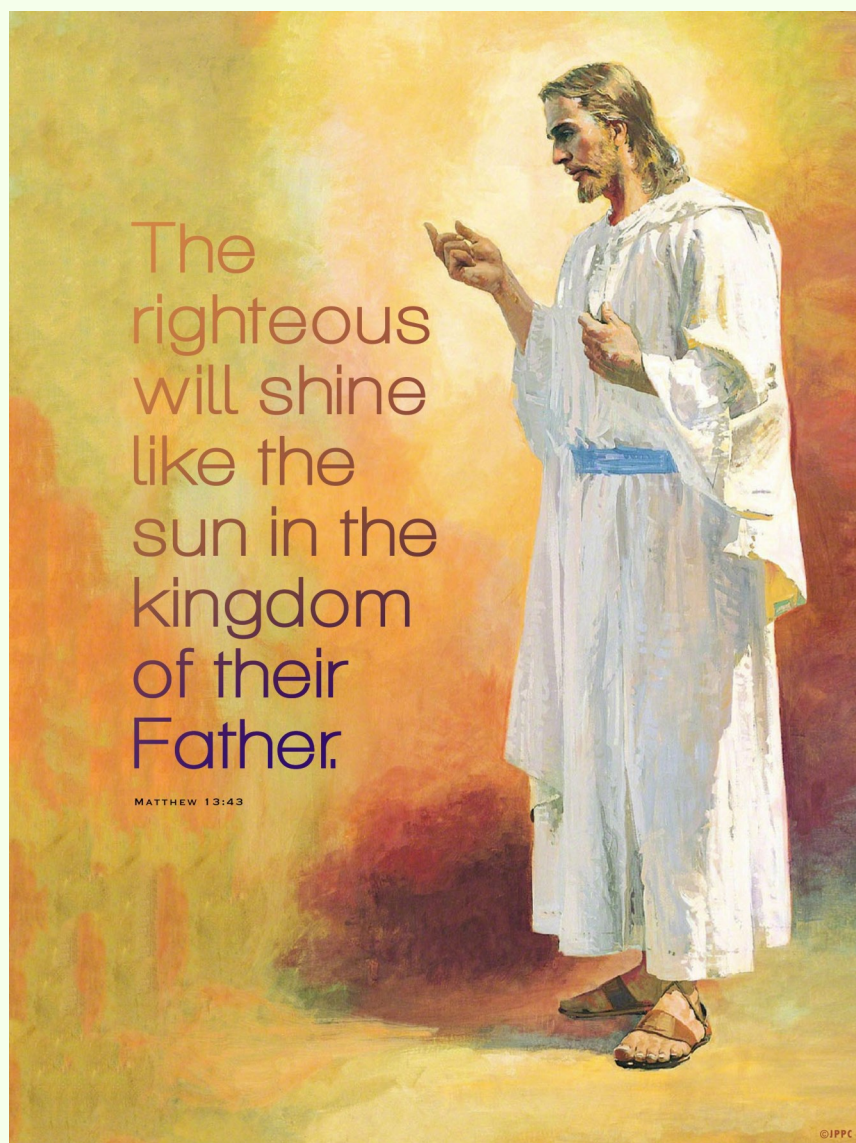

He has provided help and advice to me, and I truly appreciate what he has shared and given to us, as we continue to grow as a parish family. I am also grateful to Peter Bernot, for stepping up as our Lay Trustee. Thank you, Pete, for graciously accepting this responsibility and role.

Welcome to Theresa Pasqua, our new Coordinator of Religious Education and Youth Ministry. Through your leadership, may our students have a deeper knowledge, awareness and practice of our Catholic Faith.

In addition, here's a very timely invitation and announcement from Bishop O'Connell:

*Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M., is again inviting parishioners in the Diocese of Trenton to support the second annual collection for the **Retired, Elderly and Infirm Priests Fund** scheduled for Masses July 22 and 23. The collection is part of the diocesan observance of World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly – established three years ago by Pope Francis to be held on or near the Feast of Jesus' own grandparents, Saints Joachim and Anne. The collection, which will be taken in all Catholic churches across Burlington, Mercer, Monmouth and Ocean Counties, will be used to help fund the needs of the retired and elderly priests of the Diocese whose numbers have now reached **85**.*

*In announcing this year's collection, Bishop O'Connell stated, "As we celebrate the feast of the grandparents of Jesus, I am also mindful of the priests of the Diocese who have 'born the heat of the day' in our parishes and institutions, serving and ministering to us and who are now retired. They are truly our '**spiritual grandparents**'. Many continue to offer Masses and share the Sacraments in our parishes.*

"As Bishop, I invite all the clergy and faithful of the Diocese, once again, to show the generosity for which I have come to know you so well by contributing to the annual collection for the retired, elderly and infirm priests of the Diocese. They, too, deserve our love and gratitude in their twilight years!"

On behalf of our Bishop and our 85 retired and elderly priests, I thank you for your support and generosity.

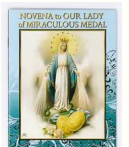

Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

What is the Feast of the Assumption?

The Assumption of Mary's body and soul into Heaven, celebrated on August 15th, is one of the dogmas of the Church. A dogma is a belief held by all Catholics.

When did the Assumption of Mary become dogma?

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII in *Munificentissimus Deus* (The Most Bountiful God) said: "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the immaculate Mother of God, the ever-Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory." Notice that he says "having completed the course of her earthly life."

Ancient belief in the Assumption

From early on, it was clear that there were no relics of Mary. There was an empty tomb in Jerusalem which quickly became a place of pilgrimage. There are also stories from early Apostolic Tradition and quotes from early Christian letters and sermons that point us toward the Assumption of Mary. The feast of the "Memory of Mary" is one of the earliest Marian feasts and was celebrated as early as the 300s. "If therefore it might come to pass by the power of your grace, it has appeared right to us your servants that, as you, having overcome death, do reign in glory, so you should raise up the body of your Mother and take her with you, rejoicing, into heaven. Then said the Savior [Jesus]: "Be it done according to your will" (*The Passing of the Virgin* 16:2-17 [A.D. 300]). -*Timothy of Jerusalem*

How is Mary's Assumption different from Jesus' Ascension?

Jesus, because He is God, ascended into Heaven by His own power. Only God can do that. Mary was assumed into Heaven by God. She was not able to do it on her own.

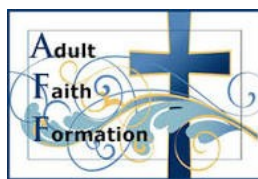
A \$50 discount is given to families who register & pay tuition in full or set up a payment plan by Aug 15, 2023.
