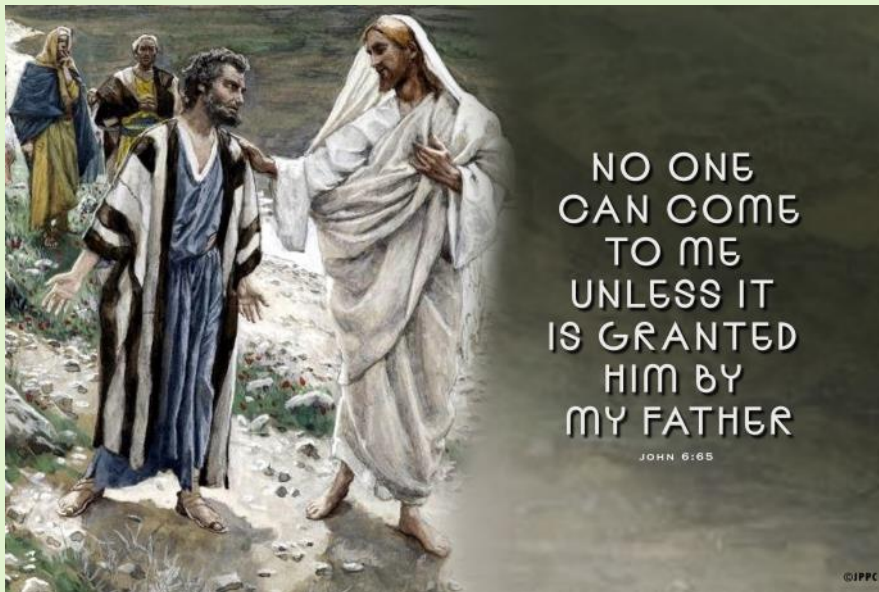

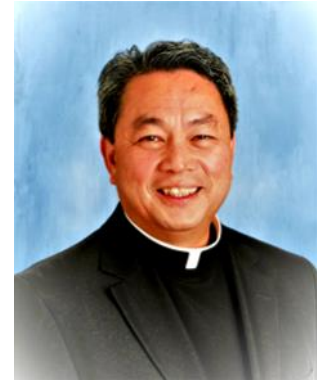

# Reverend Peter James Alindogan

Dear Friends in Christ,

Peace and Joy to you and your loved ones!

It took me awhile to type those words, considering the unfortunate events happening in the world today (pandemic, Haiti, Afghanistan to name a few). Peace may seem to be elusive to those who were affected by these changes. Joy may find it hard to seep into their grieving and worried hearts. But, try we must, we dare say, wish and pray for each other—May we have peace and may we have joy!



Having peace and joy in this life means experiencing and feeling what awaits us who believe in Jesus, our Christ. Jesus is really present in our lives, and we do believe that. Jesus Christ is really present in the Eucharist, which we receive in the Sacrifice of the Mass. That is our core belief.

Our faith deepens and is strengthened when we put the teachings of Jesus into practice. His teachings are Spirit and life. Our experiences in this life, which may be blessed for some, and for others not, tightens the bond of our spiritual and physical realms. Faith explains the unexplainable and the unexpected in the questions of our mind, and in our quest for what lies ahead. My point is—never let go of what God has planted in our hearts—faith in Him.

It was a haunting question from our Savior—“Do you also want to leave?” He saw that many of his disciples returned to their former way of life. Encountering Jesus did not change them for the better, and that is one of the saddest verses in this weekend’s Gospel. Sadder still is the reality that these disciples no longer accompanied our Lord in His journey.

“Master, to whom shall we go?” Simon Peter answered Jesus. This is one shining moment in the foremost impetuous, foot-in-his mouth apostle. “We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God.”

Jesus Christ is the Holy One of God. That we have come to believe and are convinced. He can give us the peace and joy that we need for all eternity. And so, as we battle our own trials and challenges, may we never waver and weaken in our resolve. To Jesus, we shall go.

## Obstacles to Stewardship

People who want to live as Christian disciples and Christian stewards face serious obstacles. In the United States and other nations, a dominant secular culture often contradicts religious convictions about the meaning of life. This culture frequently encourages us to focus on ourselves and our pleasures.

At times, we can find it far too easy to ignore spiritual realities and to deny religion a role in shaping human and social values. As Catholics who have entered into the mainstream of American society and experienced its advantages, many of us also have been adversely influenced by this secular culture. We know what it is to struggle against selfishness and greed, and we realize that it is harder for many today to accept the challenge of being a Christian steward. It is essential, therefore, that we make a special effort to understand the true meaning of stewardship and live accordingly.

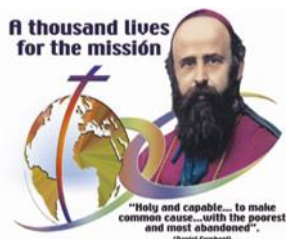
## Missionary Appeal Weekend This weekend August 21 & 22, 2021

## From The Desk of the Business Manager

Update on financials and facilities...

A few questions have come in about the parish's monthly **2nd collection for Special Projects**. This collection was added this fiscal year 2021-22 to replace the "preventative maintenance" collection. It will fund small and large scale projects around the Parish campus such as installing blinds on the front windows of the convent, painting the interior and exterior of the church, refinishing pews damaged from disinfectant sprays and hand sanitizers. The Church's beatification work— approx. \$15,000. To date you have generously donated \$4906 to this effort. **Thank you**

### Other upcoming Special Projects:

- Fob system (Sept)- replace access control panels and move to a web based system vis app and cell phone for easy access. Onsite router, server and fire wall are no longer needed. Approx. \$8,500
- Convent: exterior painting convent windows, frames, doors, fascia boards. (Awaiting est./Oct-Nov)
- tree work – removal and pruning (Aug/Sept)
- Replace camera surveillance equipment in the church slated for Jan 2022.

Many maple trees around the campus are more than 35 years old, have reached their life expectancy & have many dead or broken limbs. It is prudent to be proactive in our tree maintenance and to save dollars on future emergency tree clean-ups. Orange marks are on the trees slated for removal. A Parish Clean-up and beautification event has been planned for Oct 2. PLEASE HELP us clean the campus & new plant trees.

The Church Wifi and Live stream were not working this past weekend due to a faulty modem. It was replaced this past Monday! Continued prayers to St. Isidore of Seville, patron saint of technology that we have no more technology issues!! Also, our IT work continues with the Diocese to separate MSA school from the Church. The rectory's spotty internet service was finally fixed with a new cable line from the pole to the rectory.

Rectory building Update: A subcommittee was formed to consider options, a plan is being developed by the Finance Council, estimates are being gathered and additional repairs are being considered. More accounting to follow in the future.

The website is being updated with great information. Please take a look. Archived bulletins are now available for anyone wishing to review past information. We are looking to update our history. Volunteers are needed to preview the bulletin before it goes to print and to create new information for the bulletin and website.

Since Saint Veronica's establishment in 1962 by the Most Reverend George W Ahr of the Diocese of Trenton, our Parish has been united in a common destiny to bring the immaculate light of our Lord Jesus Christ to the dark and sinful world around us by acting as an embassy/house of God's heavenly kingdom on earth. The flame of the Holy Spirit is within our Church, but it shines, and dims based on the faith of its parishioners. Saint Veronica's Parish is steadfastly working to recover from years of spiritual decline. (Whether based on factors within the Church or the spiritually hostile world around us.) For the past, several years Mass attendance has been either stagnating or declining and we are still feeling the effects of the Covid 19 pandemic lock down.

Saint Veronica's changed greatly in its community and Church life in its short existence, it was only 6 decades ago when Fr Mitchell J. Cetkowski was appointed our first pastor. Nevertheless, we must continue to hold dearly our initial roots as a young and ambitious parish, continuing to march forward no matter the obstacles. We are now reaching a point where this current period of uncertainty in the future growth of our parish will end. The outcome of the Parish Assembly and the new Mission Statement for the Church will mark a new era, formed from a solid foundation, for our parish and flourishing community!

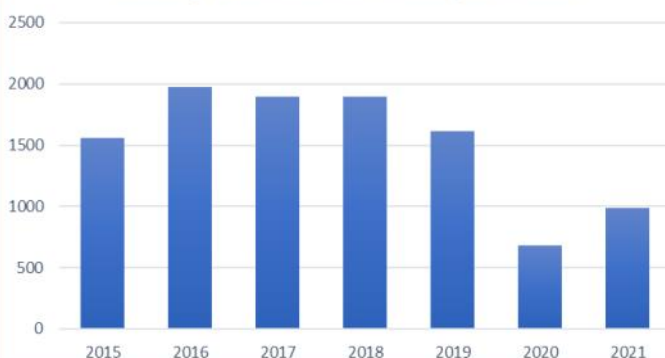

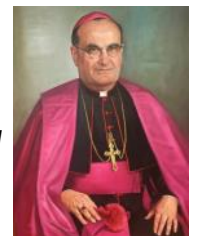

**George W Ahr** was the reigning Bishop of Trenton from 1950 to 1979 and oversaw a Catholic population increase of 300,000 to 800,000, more than a 2x population growth.
