Notes from Fr PJ

Dear Friends in Christ,

Peace!

It seems so difficult to catch up on things. We have piled up too many things to do in our lives that sleep and rest is sometimes considered to be luxurious. It is understandable, though. We need to provide for our families, support our lifestyle, contribute to our faith and our church, and more. Lots, lots more, and you could supply the rest.

I have not caught up with the books I bought two years ago, and I have been wanting to find the time to read them. Time? Am I kidding? Nope. 24 hours in a day seems to be not enough. Unless I prioritize and set into a better perspective what I need to do, not what I want, in a day.

Prayer is paramount in my daily order of activities, especially the Eucharist, where and when two or three of us are gathered together in God's name. My calling as a priest has that essential imprint in my life to pray for people entrusted to my care. A priest cannot be but a man of prayer. Once prayer is left out in the life of a priest, his very life is gone. When a priest stops praying, he loses his identity and meaning.

As it is with any human condition, praying for the needs of others can be both difficult and easy. It can be easy when the person praying lists down the needs or requests, and utters them to God. It can be hard when the person praying shares some empathy with the pains and problems expressed, when the prayer relates with them in a way that is more meaningful and spiritual. This happens to me whenever I enunciate and express the words at Mass. They become alive in significance and resonate in application.

Consider the following from one of the Eucharistic Prayers (these are expressed before Consecration):

It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Father of mercies and faithful God.

For you have given us Jesus Christ, your Son, as our Lord and Redeemer.

He always showed compassion for children and for the poor, for the sick and for sinners, and he became a neighbor to the oppressed and the afflicted.

By word and deed he announced to the world that you are our Father and that you care for all your sons and daughters.

Wow! The evocative word for me there is "always." He ALWAYS showed compassion for children and for the poor, for the sick and for sinners.

Next time you are at Mass, listen closely to the words uttered by the celebrant. Respond to them with your heart and you'll be caught up on what is truly essential in this fragile world of ours.

Another note, although Theresa Pasqua expressed her gratitude for the opportunity to work at St Veronica as our Coordinator of Religious Education, she was not able to make a full commitment to the position. As we continue to search for a new coordinator of Religious Education, please keep Theresa, our parish religious education program and the search for a new CRE in your prayers.


