

# **Notes from Fr PJ**

Dear Friends in Christ,

Peace!

I hope you had a great summer, as we celebrate Labor Day weekend. We're already in September, and time indeed flies. The beginning of the 'ber' months is also the time when my home country, the Philippines, begins playing Christmas songs. So, when asked how many seasons we have there in the tropical country, I would say three: wet, dry and three months of Christmas.



However, let me share with you some teachings about human labor from the Catechism of the Catholic Church, shortened to CCC below.

First, CCC #378: "God places [Man] in the garden. There he lives "to till it and keep it." Work is not yet a burden, but rather the collaboration of man and woman with God in perfecting the visible creation."

Human labor is not an imposition due to the Original Sin committed by Adam and Eve. It is rather part of our original dignity in perfecting nature. We work with God to perfect creation. It is after The Sin that man and woman did have to work. Eve would bring forth her children in pain, and Adam would get his food by the "sweat of his brow" as expounded in the third chapter of Genesis.

Secondly, CCC #2427: "By enduring the hardship of work in union with Jesus, the carpenter of Nazareth and the one crucified on Calvary, man collaborates in a certain fashion with the Son of God in his redemptive work. He shows himself to be a disciple of Christ by carrying the cross, daily, in the work he is called to accomplish. Work can be a means of sanctification and a way of animating earthly realities with the Spirit of Christ."

Human work is redemptive and sanctifying. We work our way towards salvation. Idleness is the devil's workshop, as we all know.

And finally, from CCC #901, which message is specifically pronounced to the laity: "dedicated as they are to Christ and anointed by the Holy Spirit, are marvelously called and prepared so that even richer fruits of the Spirit maybe produced in them. For all their works, prayers, and apostolic undertakings, family and married life, daily work, relaxation of mind and body, if they are accomplished in the Spirit—indeed even the hardships of life if patiently borne—all these become spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ."

## **Deacon's Corner**

September 3rd, 2023

Have you ever noticed that Jesus never says, in exact words, "imitate me"?

Never once does he encourage all his followers to imitate his lifestyle. But he does invite us often to "follow me."

Today's gospel is a good example, he invites all Christians: "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me". In fact, there are 19 times in the Gospels that we hear the invitation of Jesus, "follow me". What do you think is the meaning of Jesus' invitation to all of us?

I believe we all follow him by dying and rising with him through our Baptism. But, carrying our cross doesn't mean moving toward and ending with the suffering at Calvary.

And, I don't think it means seeking out suffering. Throughout his earthly life, Jesus did not seek out suffering; he merely accepted it. The sufferings he endured were part of his, and part of our, human condition, not part of some personally chosen self-denial. Remember, Jesus cried, sweat, hungered, stubbed his toe, thirsted, etc. Just. Like. Us.

So, my friends, I believe bearing the Cross of Christ means bearing our personal crosses as they come to us: it means accepting what we'd like to avoid, it means a steadfast loyalty to the way of Christ in all our daily living.

So, the bottom line, I feel, is that true conformity to the Cross of Christ is entirely individual and unique for each one of us; because it means accepting the Will of God in our ordinary, daily life, even if that sometimes seems to come at us fast and furiously.

This week, keep St. Padre Pio's words in mind: "Pray, hope, and don't worry".


