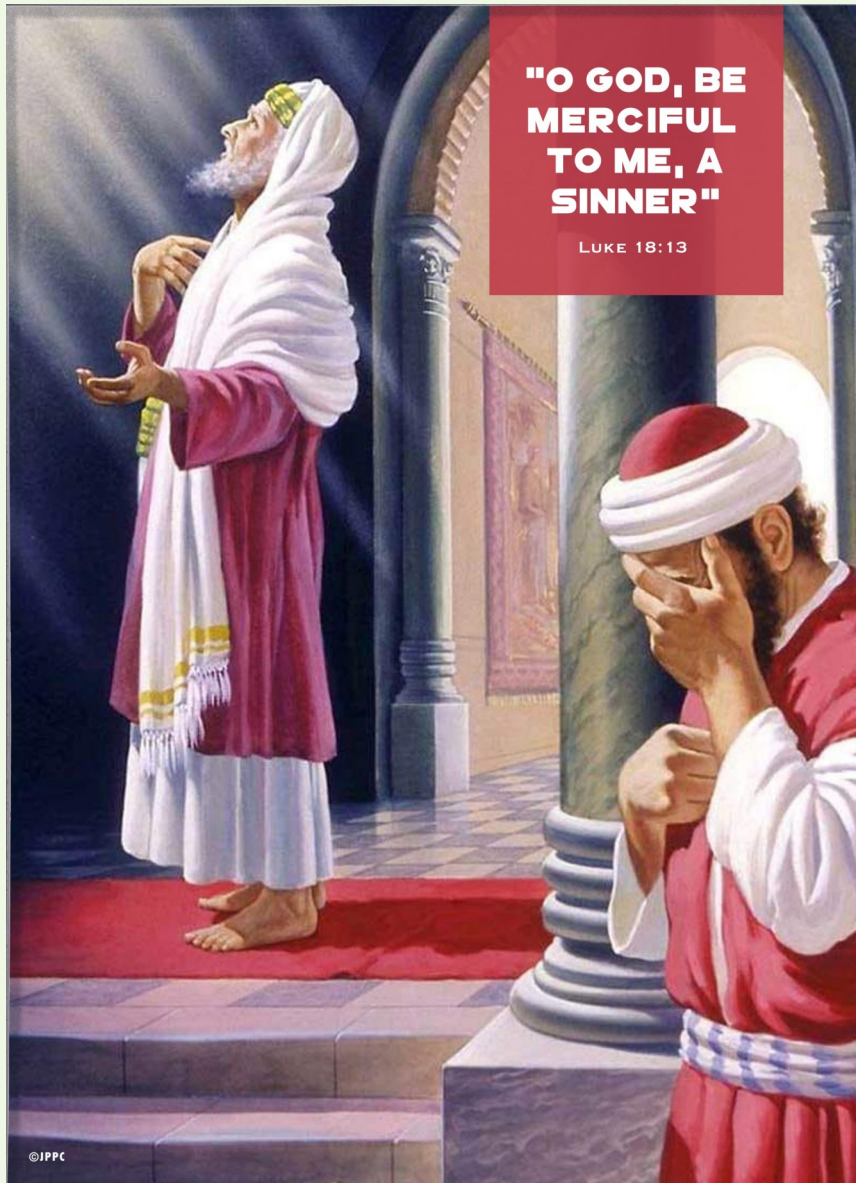

Notes from Fr. PJ

Dear Friends in Christ,

Peace!

Our Diocesan celebration for World Mission Sunday will take place here, at the Church of St. Veronica this Saturday, Oct. 22 at 4:00 p.m. We warmly welcome Bishop David M. O'Connell, who is our Main celebrant and Preacher. Msgr. Kieran Harrington, the National Director of the Pontifical Mission Societies and other invited missionary priests will also be concelebrating.



Daniella Les, a student from St. Mary of the Lakes School, Medford, won the grand prize for her artwork in the National Christmas Card Making Contest of the Missionary Childhood Association. She will be presented the award during the celebration and certificates of recognition will be given to previous awardees. This is the fifth time in a row that our Diocese has been a recipient of the national award.

The Pontifical Mission Societies has four major components, namely: Society for the Propagation of the Faith, Missionary Childhood Association, Society of St. Peter and Missionary Union of Priests and Religious.

The SOCIETY FOR THE PROPAGATION OF THE FAITH continues to seek prayer and sacrifice for the world's missions, now some 1,100 dioceses in Asia, Africa, the Pacific Islands and remote regions of Latin America. It offers support for pastoral and evangelizing programs, catechists and catechetical work, building new churches, health care, education, communication and transportation needs. It provided some \$7 million in help to the new and growing churches in the United States.

The MISSIONARY CHILDHOOD ASSOCIATION provides for more than 2 million children who are enrolled in catechesis and Christian formation programs, as well as more than 600,000 children in nursery school through secondary school. Additional help is sent for more than 700,000 children benefiting from programs for "protection of life." This includes health care (basic, rehabilitation, children with disabilities and special needs), advocacy (orphaned children, street children, child soldiers, human trafficking), and outreach (food, water).

The SOCIETY OF ST. PETER, in the first year of its foundation, aided some 2,700 seminarians. Today, some 28,000 major seminarians, mostly in Asia and Africa, receive an average annual subsidy of \$700 per student; assistance is also provided for men and women Religious novices. Here's a rundown of amount that we can provide:

\$60 for one month's support of a seminarian in Africa or Asia - textbooks, technology, food, medical care

\$180 provides resources for one seminarian

\$700 for one year's support of one seminarian

The MISSIONARY UNION OF PRIESTS AND RELIGIOUS supports those engaged in catechesis and religious education who work to help Catholics better understand their baptismal responsibility for the Church's missionary work. With the understanding that only you know what gift amount is right for your own life circumstance, be assured that your continued support will help prepare tomorrow's mission priests, who will proclaim the Gospel, celebrate the Sacraments, and serve the poor in the world's most vulnerable communities.

I ask you to contribute and share generously in this World Mission Sunday collection. When you do, you make it possible for our Holy Father, Pope Francis, to provide for the formation of our seminarians and religious men and women. When you do, you assist in building the schools and orphanages that care for children in places few visit.

When you do, missionaries can build churches in areas with scarce resources. When you do, priests and religious Brothers and Sisters can buy food and the bare essentials that make it possible to proclaim the Gospel and celebrate the Sacraments.

May your help and love for the Church's Mission, which is a passion for Jesus and a passion for his people, grow ever stronger. And, may your support and generosity be rewarded a hundredfold in this life and the next.

Bishop O'Connell's series on the Eucharist to launch Oct. 18

In a new five-part series on the Eucharist, Bishop David M. O'Connell, C. M., highlights "many aspects of the inexhaustible gift and mystery of the Holy Eucharist as the Body and Blood of the Lord Jesus Christ drawn from Scripture and Tradition." Titled "Catechetical Series on the Eucharist," the segments will begin Oct. 18, the Feast of St. Luke. An installment will drop each week in text, video and podcast across all diocesan digital platforms.

The entire series will be printed in the November issue of *The Monitor Magazine*.



The five installments of the series will cover:

- Preface and Part One (Oct. 18)** • Eucharist as "mystery" and "reality"; faith as a supernatural gift; Jesus' words, "Do this in memory of me," as the institution of the Sacrament of Eucharist
- Part Two (Oct. 25)** • Catechesis as necessary for belief in the Real Presence of Jesus; Scripture accounts of God's presence among his people
- Part Three (Nov. 1)** • Excerpts from great theologians, saints, Scripture, emphasizing the unchanging fundamental belief in the Eucharist
- Part Four (Nov. 8)** • Excerpts from Papal, Vatican II, U.S. Bishop's documents demonstrating continuity and constancy of Eucharistic doctrine
- Part Five (Nov. 15)** • Eucharistic Lexicon including words, terms and expressions describing or referring to Holy Eucharist or its celebration

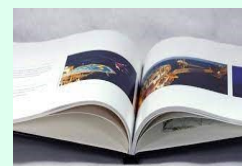

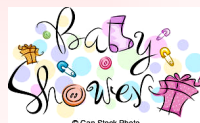
RESPECT LIFE COMMUNION BREAKFAST AND BIRTHRIGHT SHOWER

TAX RELIEF for NJ Residents

Residents have two opportunities to get some of their property taxes back through the "Senior Freeze" Property Tax Reimbursement Program (PTR) and the new Affordable New Jersey Communities for Homeowners (ANCHOR) Program, which has replaced the Homestead Rebate. These two programs are part of a continuing effort to make New Jersey more affordable and fairer for all residents.

While Senior Freeze, as the name implies, is available to seniors, ANCHOR is available to everyone who pays property taxes with annual incomes of \$250,000 or less.

Both programs now extend property tax relief to renters as well as homeowners.
