

Notes from Fr. PJ

Dear Friends in Christ,

Peace and joy in your hearts!

The mouth speaks from the fullness of the heart. This is what Jesus said once and is repeated in this weekend's Gospel. Or, to paraphrase it, it is from our heart that our mouth speaks. Whatever is stored inside is blurted out and discovered on the outside by the way we talk.

This seems to be a general observation.

And there is one more: we find moments when people talk a lot (so that it can sometimes be hard to listen). Maybe they are preventing revealing their inner self. Their speaking becomes a smoke screen to hide the real issue. Constant talk about the importance of power and authority may indicate an unwillingness to dialogue. Compulsive talk about one's work may be a way not to talk about the problems of one's life.

Because, you see and we all know, our unguarded moments reveal what we have stored in our hearts.

Thus, if we are easily angered with a person, perhaps our hearts have huge storage of resentments due to frustration. Or, if we keep talking against a person, perhaps our hearts may reveal another storage of envy or jealousy. Or, if we dislike some people for one reason or another, can it be because our hearts are storing our false sense of self, insecurity and pride?

The splinter is seen in others, but not the beam in our own eyes. Jesus, our Lord, observed and taught this.

Thus, our loving Lord invites us today to look at the people around us. Are they good enough? Are we happy with them? Is nobody good enough? What are the complaints we make against them?

Our answer reveals much about ourselves. Our answer exposes the content of our hearts. Our answer to these questions tells us how we are moving forward to or backward from our Lord Jesus Christ.

- The 2021-2023 the Synod is designed to give all the faithful of the Catholic Church a chance to express life experiences of journeying with the Church

Pope Francis is inviting all to participate! He wants to hear from the entire church, all the people of God so to bring their voices to the synod.

The way St. Veronica and other parishes in the Diocese of Trenton will do this is through listening sessions or meetings which will be held over the next 8 weeks.

What are LISTENING SESSIONS?

- An opportunity to come together, to pray and to share personal experiences of joys and obstacles of the church
- Sharing and listening Not about data gathering, problemsolving, complaining, or debating controversial issues
- Participants share for four (4) minutes each while others actively listen and two (2) minutes is then given to respond to what was heard
- small groups comprised of 6 to 8 people; one-on-one interviews are also available
- zoom or in person listening sessions are available
- trained parish facilitators and notetakers are present in each small group to guide the meeting and take notes. No identifying information on participants will be passed on. The note taker will report to the diocese on the "gist" of each story. The diocese will form the basis of their report to the Pope for the 2023 Synod of Bishops.

Each participant will have four (4) minutes to share their experience on the following question:

What have been the joys and obstacles in your journeying together with the church? Please share a brief story that illustrates your experience.




