

Dear Friends in Christ,

Peace and Joy to you in this blessed season of Lent!

This is a sad and unexpected news.

Sister Danielle Marie Baran, C.R., the Provincial Superior of the Sisters of the Resurrection, has informed me that after consultation and approval of their Provincial Council, our Sisters will no longer be serving our Parish effective July 2022. In her letter to Bishop O'Connell that Sister Danielle shared with me, she wrote that "this was a difficult decision for our Congregation to make. A number of retired religious and fewer vocations have impacted our apostolic ministries."

The Sisters of the Resurrection have been an essential part in the spiritual growth of the Parish of St. Veronica. They have journeyed with us, our children, and some of our grandchildren since founding St. Veronica School in 1965, at the invitation of Rev. Cetkowski, the founding pastor. They have provided our parish with dedicated staffing and administration in our school and catechetical programs for decades.


I, myself, am sad to see them go.

Sister Cecilia, the Sister Superior of the Convent and our Pastoral Associate, has helped us tremendously in the preparation of our Sunday liturgies. She is also the Chairperson of our Liturgy Committee. Sister Ann Elizabeth has done excellent work in our various ministries, specifically as Director of our Religious Education program. Sister Laurie-Marie, who presently teaches in St. Rose in Belmar, also helped us before as a member of our Parish Pastoral Council.

As we continually pray for more vocations—priests, religious sisters and religious brothers—to serve the Church, please also join me in praying for our Sisters of the Resurrection. Do thank them for their ministry to us. We will surely miss their help, support and encouragement, among countless other great things.

40 DAYS FOR LIFE

The 40 Days for Life is a campaign of prayer and fasting for an end to
abortion here in America, from March 2 to April 10. Since its inception in
2007, 20,728 babies have been saved, 229 abortion workers have quit,
and 114 abortion centers have closed. 40 Days for Life also involves
prayerful, peaceful witnessing in front of an abortion clinic. People pray
the Rosary or other prayers for one hour while walking along the
sidewalk.

Here in Monmouth, the site is the Planned Parenthood facility at 69 E. Newman Springs Rd in Shrewsbury. We
staff each Wednesday from March 2 to April 10. That would be 6 Wednesdays.

LENT— Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving



Today, for those to be baptized at Easter, we begin to celebrate the Scrutinies this Sunday. When we scrutinize something, we look at it carefully and examine it thoroughly. The RCIA rites called the Scrutinies are a time for the Elect, those to be baptized, to look within themselves to find anything that keeps them from Christ. Then they look to Jesus to heal those weaknesses and strengthen them when they face temptation. As they move closer to Easter and Baptism, they may experience more temptations because the evil one would prevent their Baptism if he could. So it is very important that we pray for our Elect and that they ask for the Church's prayers in the Scrutinies. At the First Scrutiny, we hear the Gospel about Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well. Just as Jesus slowly reveals Himself to her, so He has been revealing Himself to these Elect during their months of preparation, that they may walk in the light of Christ. Just as Jesus offers the woman the Living Water, which is Himself, so He offers the Elect the living water of Baptism where they will receive the Holy Spirit of God. May Jesus awaken a thirst for this Living Water in each of our Elect. May He protect them from all that would take them from Him.



Just a reminder that the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat (red meat and poultry)!

More than any other time in the Church calendar, Lent focuses our attention on the human struggle with our weaknesses and failings, on our need for a Savior. Historically, Lent was a time when people did public penance, prayers or actions that express contrition (sorrow for sin).

At the beginning of Lent, the bishop placed ashes on those seeking forgiveness and gave them a public penance to perform. Often, these were people who had denied their faith in Christ out of fear during times of severe persecution. They spent forty days humbling themselves as they sought to be fully reconciled with God and His Church. At Easter, they were welcomed back and could once again receive the Eucharist.

Today, we express our sorrow for our sins during Lent with prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

We remember that, as Psalm 51 tells us, God will not spurn a humble, contrite heart.


Let us make our sacrifice a heart that is humble and contrite.



Pope Francis is inviting all to participate! He wants to hear from the entire church, all the people of God so to bring their voices to the 2023 Synod of Bishops.

The way St. Veronica and other parishes in the Diocese of Trenton will do this is through listening sessions or meetings till the end of March 2022.

What are LISTENING SESSIONS?

- An opportunity to come together, to pray and to share personal experiences of joys and obstacles of the church
- Sharing and listening - Not about data gathering, problem-solving, complaining, or debating controversial issues
- Participants share for four (4) minutes each while others actively listen and two (2) minutes is then given to respond to what was heard
- small groups comprised of 6 to 8 people; one-on-one interviews are also available
- zoom or in person listening sessions are available
- trained parish facilitators and notetakers are present in each small group to guide the meeting and take notes. No identifying information on participants will be passed on. The note taker will report to the diocese on the "gist" of each story. The diocese will form the basis of their report to the Pope for the 2023 Synod of Bishops.

Each participant will have four (4) minutes to share their experience on the following question:

What have been the joys and obstacles in your journeying together with the church? Please share a brief story that illustrates your experience.


