

Notes from Fr. PJ

Dear Friends in Christ,

Peace!

Lent—past participle of the verb 'lend." It reminds me of our very "own" lives (or we think we own it—our life). It was just *lent*. Lent, which to me means what we have is not really ours. It was just *lent*. Lent, which also means to me that there is a true Owner, who owns whatever was *lent*.



And so, we started with something basic last Wednesday. Our foreheads were marked with ashes to symbolize the passing of things and people (and anything or anyone lent to us), repentance of sins and belief in the Good News. Sin once diluted the purity of our souls, like ashes on a clean-washed face. Death was the by-product. Thus, to dust thou art and to dust thou shalt return, as the Old English formula for the imposition of ashes doth declare.

With all the smudge, the dirt, the blotch, the stain, with all the streak, the mark, the daub, and maybe the pain—we hear a familiar strain—"Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel."

Turn away from sin—repent. Be faithful to the Gospel—believe in the Good News. What is the Good News? Jesus Christ is God. He died, he conquered death, rose from it. He will come again. No better news other than that in the whole history of civilization.

When He does come at an unexpected time, I hope we give our Lord a heartfelt answer, especially when He asks us, "And, dear child of mine, how did you do with what I *lent* you?"

Have a blessed and prayerful Lenten season!

40 DAYS FOR LIFE

The 40 Days for Life is a campaign of prayer and fasting for an end to abortion here in America, from March 2 -to April 10. Since its inception in 2007, 20,728 babies have been saved, 229 abortion workers have quit, and 114 abortion centers have closed. 40 Days for Life also involves prayerful, peaceful witnessing in front of an abortion clinic. People pray the Rosary or other prayers for one hour while walking along the sidewalk.

Here in Monmouth, the site is the Planned Parenthood facility at 69 E. Newman Springs Rd in Shrewsbury. We staff each Wednesday from March 2 to April 10. That would be 6 Wednesdays.

LENT—Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving



Lent is a 40 day period, not including Sundays, of preparation and spiritual growth. We die to ourselves so that we, like Jesus, might rise again to new life. The dying and rebirth that take place within our hearts reflect the paschal mystery – the suffering, death, resurrection, and ascension of our Lord Jesus. Lent, which means spring, is the time of final preparation for those being baptized at Easter, but the whole Church also enters into the spirit of penance. Lenten practices help us do penance and prepare ourselves for the great celebration of Easter. These practices are fasting (limiting food or giving something up during Lent), spending more time in prayer, and setting aside money for the poor (almsgiving).

If you haven't already, make a plan for Lent – not so difficult that you will be tempted to abandon it, but challenging enough that it hurts a little!

(And remember that we NEVER fast on the Day of the Resurrection, so on Sundays, you can have a piece of that chocolate you gave up for Lent!)







What is a SYNOD?

- Synod derived from the Greek word synodos. "assembly" is a gathering or an authoritative meeting of bishops working in partnership with the Holy Father for the purpose of church administration in the areas of teaching (faith and morals) or governance (church discipline or law).
- Synod: path of Communion, participation and mission
- The 2021-2023 the Synod is designed to give all the faithful of the Catholic Church a chance to express life experiences of journeying with the Church

Pope Francis is inviting all to participate! He wants to hear from the entire church, all the people of God so to bring their voices to the synod.

The way St. Veronica and other parishes in the Diocese of Trenton will do this is through listening sessions or meetings which will be held over the next 8 weeks.

What are LISTENING SESSIONS?
