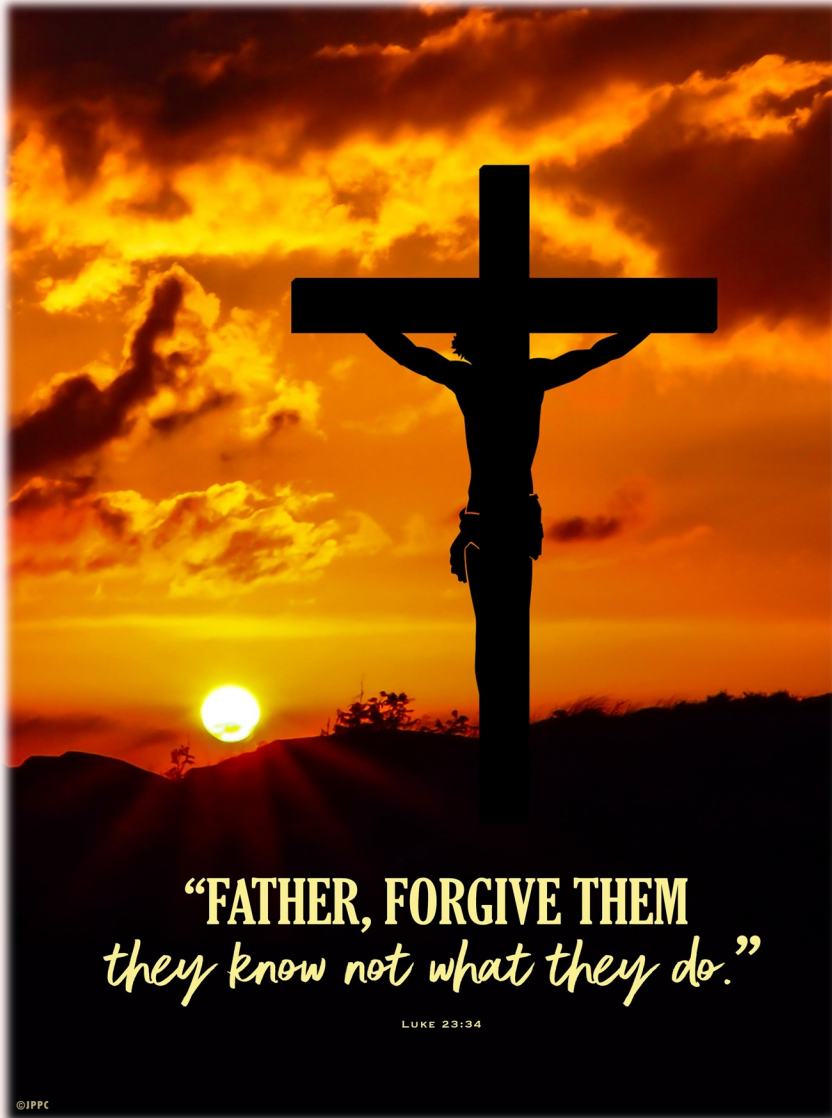

Holy Saturday

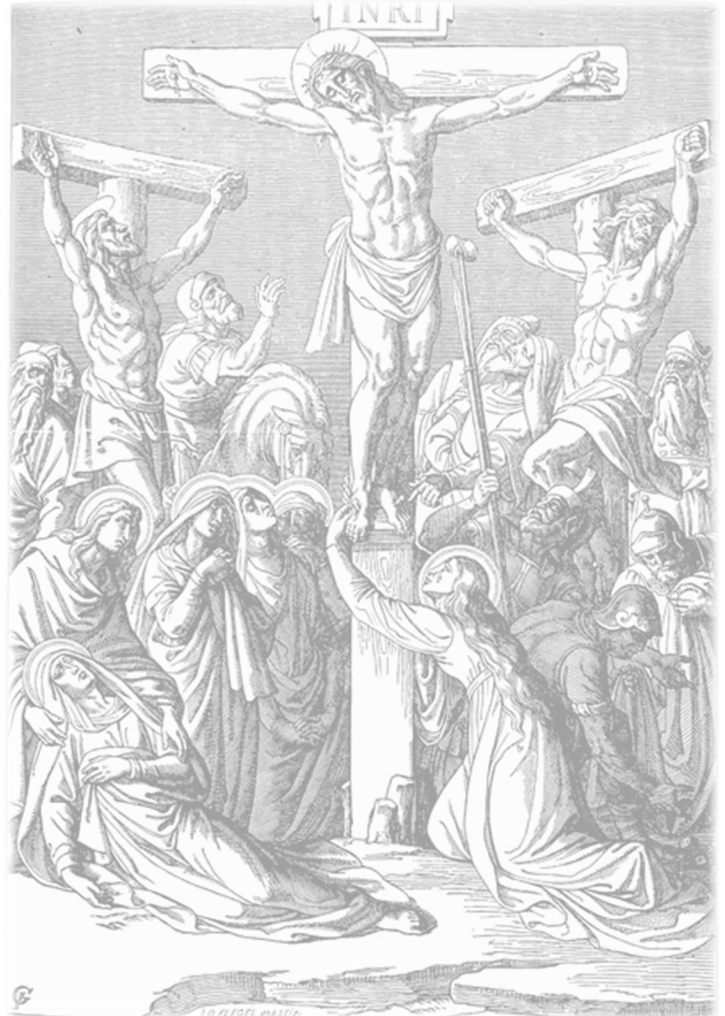
- Blessing of Easter Food Baskets at 1:00PM

We are called to Sanctify



During Holy Week, we enter into the Mystery of Christ's passion, death, and Resurrection. We celebrate the historical events of this most sacred week in a sacramental way that makes these mysteries present to us.

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

On the first day of Holy Week, we recall Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. Jesus rode into the city on a donkey, as people waved palms and laid their cloaks on the ground before Him, acclaiming Him as the Son of David and shouting, "Hosanna!"

At the Palm Sunday Mass, we too hold palm branches as we listen to this story and sing "Hosanna in the highest" to our King. But, later in that same Mass, we also hear the story of Jesus' Passion and Death on the Cross, when people cried out to Pontius Pilate, "Crucify Him!" We reflect on how the crowd turned against Jesus so quickly, and especially, how fickle we can be in our love for Him.

The Blessing of Easter Food Baskets

will take place on Holy Saturday,
April 16, 2022 at 1:00PM in the Church.

In many Eastern European countries, it is an important tradition to have a basket of food blessed on Holy Saturday or Easter Sunday. *Święconka* means "the blessing of the Easter baskets." It is one of the most enduring and beloved Polish traditions. This blessing is still found in the updated Roman Ritual, and is a wonderful practice for all families. Many parishes including St. Veronica Parish still participates in this custom

of the blessing of the Easter food or baskets. The food items placed in the Easter basket for blessing have special significance.

Although each family may have its own traditions, there are some practices that are universal. A typical Eastern European Easter basket would include a variety of symbolic foods. There is a special blessing for meat, egg, cake, and bread, so baskets will most likely include these ingredients.

- Bacon (*boczek/słonina*, BOH-chek/swoh-NEE-nah) is a symbol of the abundance of God's mercy. Bread (*chleb*, hlehb) is usually a braided [chętka](#), representing the staff of life given by God.
- Easter bread (*babka*, BAHB-kah) is a round cake of rich, eggy yeast dough with raisins that is reminiscent of the risen Lord.
- Butter (*masło*, MAHS-woh) is one of the dairy products included to celebrate the end of Lent and the richness of our salvation. The butter is often shaped into a lamb, which is symbolic of the Paschal Lamb, and is known as a *baranek*. Sometimes the *baranek* is made of dough, wood, or even plastic. It can also be made of sugar, when it is known as *baranek cukrowy wielkanocny*.
- Candles (*swieca*, SHVIEH-tsa) symbolize Jesus, the "light of the world," and can be lit when the priest blesses the baskets of food.
- Cheese (*ser*, SEHRR) is a symbol to remind Christians of moderation.
- Colored eggs (*pisanki*, pee-SAHN-kee), as well as uncolored hard-cooked eggs, indicate hope, new life, and Christ rising from his tomb.
- Ham (*szynka*, SHIN-kah), as well as other meats, symbolizes great joy and abundance in celebration of Christ's resurrection.
- Sausage links (*kiełbasa*, kyehw-BAH-sah) are symbolic of the chains of death that were broken when Jesus rose from the dead, as well as of God's generosity.
- Horseradish (*chrzan*, HZAHN) is a reminder of the bitterness and harshness of the Passion of Jesus, and the vinegar it is mixed with symbolizes the sour wine given to Jesus on the cross.
- Salt (*sól*, SOOL) is present to add zest to life and preserve us from corruption. Sweets (*słodycze*, swoh-DIH-cheh) suggest the promise of eternal life or good things to come.

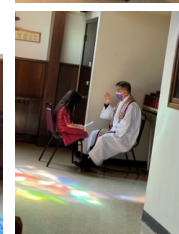
The Sacrament of Reconciliation

Easter Triduum

The triduum (three days) are the most holy days of the Church year. We celebrate three days of prayer and worship beginning on the evening of Holy Thursday and ending on Easter Sunday.

Holy Thursday *The Mass of the Lord's Supper*

The Holy Thursday Mass celebrates the institution of the Holy Eucharist, the first Mass.

The night before Jesus died, He gave us this most important Sacrament which fulfills His promise to be with us always.

We hear how Jesus washed the feet of His Apostles to show us that we must serve others in humility of heart, and our priests model Him as they kneel to wash the feet of 12 parishioners.

At the end of Mass, the priest takes the Blessed Sacrament from the main tabernacle to a separate altar of repose.

In the silence that follows, we worship our Jesus in the Holy Eucharist, praising Him in the silence of our hearts for the great gift of Himself.

We also thank Jesus for the priesthood, as it was at the Last Supper that He ordained the Apostles as the first priests and bishops.

Without holy priests, there would be no one to celebrate the Sacraments for us.

Good Friday of the Lord's Passion

On Good Friday, the commemoration of Jesus' suffering and death, we listen again to the account of His Passion. We humble ourselves before Him, and recognize that, because we are sinners, we, too, had a part in His death. We approach and reverence the cross, our symbol of God's love for us, and we thank Jesus for His perfect sacrifice for us on the Cross.

Good Friday is a universal day of fast and abstinence, as we go to the Cross with Jesus.

Holy Saturday

During the day of Holy Saturday, we waited in silence at the tomb of the Lord.

At the Easter Vigil, we celebrate in joy that Jesus is risen from the dead!

The Proclamation of Easter, known as the Exultet, rings through the church lit only by the Paschal Candle and our small taper candles, as Christ dispels the darkness.

We remember God's saving plan for humanity as we listen to the Old Testament readings.

We sing the Alleluia for the first time since Lent began.

We recall our own baptism and renew the promises made then, as we witness children and adults being baptized.

We rejoice as these new Christians are confirmed and receive our Lord in the Holy Eucharist for the first time.
