

# Notes from Fr. PJ



Dear Friends in Christ,  
Peace and Blessings!

I read it somewhere that for most people, their number one fear is public speaking. Number two is death. One comedian quipped what this means: if you have to go to a funeral, you're better off in the casket than giving the eulogy.

The other fear, which could be secondary, is that of public humiliation.

In this weekend's Gospel, the woman that was brought before our Lord was humiliated. Not only was she embarrassed for her actions in the presence of Jesus, but she also feared her impending death. She trembled in fear, maybe wishing that she could die that very moment. She felt so naked in their midst.

What she did was wrong. Adultery destroys the family, the moral fiber of our society. And the men, circling like vultures around this sinful woman, were ready with their stones.

Why did these men want to throw stones at her? Perhaps the same reasons we sometimes also want to throw stones at people.

We follow the rules. We tow the line. They do not. Here is a stone flung to the sinful. They had it easy and we are angry. We go with the flow. We obey regulations and God's commandments. They do not. Another stone. We have been doing things right, or so we think. They are not. They do things wrong. Stone you!

These are not just stones in the literal sense of the word, but emotional ones, figurative ones. These are stones thrown at people we live with, people we love, people we know. These are stones built by hurtful comments, or whenever we get unreasonably critical and cynical, whenever we are realistically short of understanding what other people are also going through.

Then Jesus bent down to write something on the ground. He spoke, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." After this, our good Lord went back to writing on the ground.

Jesus, the Sinless Savior of all, was making them aware that sinful people are in no position to throw stones at their fellow sinners. When we condemn people for what they had done, when we, sinners as we are, start passing judgment on others, then we end up passing judgment on ourselves. Two fingers pointed judging you, three fingers pointed back judging me, judging us.

There is one thing we all have in common—we are all sinners. We need some healing for all our pains--the times we threw stones at other people, the dark and sad moments when we condemned and judged people wrongly.

All of us need a second chance, and more. And just like the woman in the Gospel and those who accused her, we all have a need to be forgiven.



Lent is essentially about death and dying. As we slowly recover from the pandemic, we need to reflect on a deeper faith element that we all share and is permanent—the end of our temporal lives.

Knowing the enemy is winning half the battle. Death is an enemy for the unbeliever. But for those who believe in Jesus, who conquered death, it can be a friend.

When we talk about the end or meaning of life, we raise the question of God. For if there is a God, God is the meaning of life.

Instead of asking, "Is there a God?," our question should be, "Will I see God?"

## April 6 - Seder Meal 7:00PM in the Cafeteria.

Celebrating the Seder Meal is a traditional and most pleasant form of fellowship and shared learning experience. It is a meal that not only commemorates the Jews' deliverance but also hope for the coming kingdom of God. It draws relationships between the Passover and important New Testament truths. ## LENT— Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving



If there's anything Lent points us to, it's self-denial and sacrifice. That's because, if we are really going to follow Jesus, each of us must deny ourselves, take up our cross, and follow the Master.

The way of the Christian is the Way of the Cross.

If we are going to arrive at the Resurrection, as Jesus did, we are going to have to go through the Cross and death, as He did.

Our sufferings, large or small, can be transformed by our willingness to accept them and by offering them in prayer for the good of others.

Jesus' death on the Cross was for our salvation. When we try not to complain about our struggles, but offer them instead to Jesus as a way to relieve the sufferings of others, we are imitating Him at the Crucifixion.

Most of our trials and tribulations are small, but our response to them is significant.

Being patient in slow traffic or the long line at the grocery store. Doing the chore that someone else left undone.

Listening to someone who has no one else to talk to, even when you would rather be doing something else.

These are all occasions for grace for ourselves and others, when we deny ourselves and offer the inconvenience to our Lord.

Some of our troubles are much larger.

The loss of a loved one. The betrayal of a friend.


A serious illness.

Even in the midst of our grief and illness, we can still offer our sufferings to Jesus, because we know He, too, suffered all these things.

That's why, during Lent, it's important to pray the Stations of the Cross. The fourteen Stations, which hang in every Catholic church, remind us of the steps Jesus took on the way to His death.

As we process from Station to Station, we reflect on Christ's Passion and death, and we unite ourselves, our lives, our struggles and tears, to His. We offer our own lives as a sacrifice for others, as Jesus did for us.

We trust in God the Father, as Jesus did, that suffering and death will not have the last word. After suffering and death comes resurrection and glory.



The 40 Days for Life is a campaign of prayer and fasting for an end to abortion here in America, from


March 2 to April 10. Since its inception in 2007, 20,728 babies have been saved, 229 abortion workers have quit, and 114 abortion centers have closed. 40 Days for Life also involves prayerful, peaceful witnessing in front of an abortion clinic. People pray the Rosary or other prayers for one hour while walking along the sidewalk.

Here in Monmouth, the site is the Planned Parenthood facility at 69 E. Newman Springs Rd in Shrewsbury. We staff each Wednesday from March 2 to April 10. That would be 6 Wednesdays.


