Notes from Fr. PJ

Dear Friends in Christ, Peace!

<u>Thank You.</u> Thank you for celebrating with us our Opening Mass and Parish Family Picnic last Sunday. Thank you to our hardworking volunteers, ably coordinated by Linda, our Business Manager. If you were there, you would have seen the

games, the bouncy house, the burgers, hotdogs, bags of popcorn, ice cream sandwiches and tons of desserts (brought by you, dear friends!). You would have also seen your priests doing line dancing, and even Bishop Santos, who came from Papua New Guinea. But, if you happened to be somewhere else that day, the pictures in the bulletin this week will somehow suffice. Hope to see you, though, in our next parish and community building event sometime.

As I write this message today, July 12th, the Feast of our Patroness, St. Veronica, I could not help but keep you in my thoughts and prayers. We've been through a lot this past couple of years, and it seems that the threat of contacting the virus is still out there. We've also been through a lot of transitions and changes, and for some, even losses.

The priest in me has this preachy voice addressing us—Let's keep it all together. Or to be cheesy about it and hearing inside now the voice of Diana Ross, "if we hold on together, I know our dreams will never die."

<u>Wednesday's Talk about Blessed Pauline Jaricot</u>. We do not know much about her. She was the Foundress of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. She was beatified last May in France and I was blessed to concelebrate at her beatification Mass. I will give a presentation about her life on Wednesday in Church and I will also share some stories about the Missions. As the Director of Missions in the Diocese of Trenton, I am one lucky priest to be a conduit of the sharing and giving culture that our Catholic Church has done since 33 A.D. The Pontifical Mission Societies, that's right, Pope Francis's Mission Societies has four components: Society for the Propagation of the Faith, Missionary Childhood Association, Missionary Union of Priests and Religious and Society of St. Peter. We also coordinate the mission appeal talks, which are normally held during the summer in our diocese. Missionaries from all over the world visit our parishes and share about their life-giving and faith-enriching stories.

<u>August 6 and 7 Mission Appeal Weekend.</u> The Pontifical Institute for Foreign Missions (also known as PIME) will have their representative speaking at our parish on the weekend of August 6 and 7. Kindly welcome Fr. Dennis Koltz that weekend and be generous also with your charitable contributions to his missionary endeavours.

July 23-24 is World Day of Elderly and Collection for our Retired Priests in the Diocese. Speaking of charitable contributions—Bishop O'Connell has asked our help and invited us to consider contributing generously to support our retired, elderly and infirm priests. He said that he talked about promoting vocations in our diocese because of the extreme shortage. It was a staggering statistic in what he wrote: *"Twenty-five years ago, there were* **12 retired priests** in the Diocese of *Trenton. Today* **there are 75**. *Five years from now,* **there will be over 100 retired priests here.** *We face a shortage of resources to provide for the basic needs of this quickly growing group. It strikes me, as Bishop, that we need to do something significant to support these men who "still bear fruit."*

<u>Finally, a blast from the past.</u> This is the early history of our parish as printed in the Jubilee Book: In the 50's and 60's Howell Township was a sleepy rural area dotted by new home development with starting prices below \$ 20,000. Route 9 was a single lane highway and Howell residents didn't yet run on Dunkin Donuts coffee. A 20 acre tract of land was selected and submitted to Bishop George Ahr. Upon all approvals, the land was purchased for \$ 56,000.00 by the Diocese. On June 1, 1962, Father Cetkowski was appointed Pastor of the newly formed parish of St. Veronica's.

That's too much for now. Keep well and regards.


We ask you to comfort us in our pains, fortify us in our trials and ever be with us in this pilgrimage of earthly life.



Why is the Eucharist so important for the Church today?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church

II. WHAT IS THIS SACRAMENT CALLED?

1328 The inexhaustible richness of this sacrament is expressed in the different names we give it. Each name evokes certain aspects of it. It is called: **Eucharist**, because it is an action of thanksgiving to God. The Greek words *eucharistein*¹⁴¹ and *eulogein*¹⁴² recall the Jewish blessings that proclaim - especially during a meal - God's works: creation, redemption, and sanctification.

1329 The Lord's Supper, because of its connection with the supper which the Lord took with his disciples on the eve of his Passion and because it anticipates the wedding feast of the Lamb in the heavenly Jerusalem.¹⁴³ The *Breaking of Bread*, because Jesus used this rite, part of a Jewish meal, when as master of the table he blessed and distributed the bread,¹⁴⁴ above all at the Last Supper.¹⁴⁵ It is by this action that his disciples will recognize him after his Resurrection,¹⁴⁶ and it is this expression that the first Christians will use to designate their Eucharistic assemblies;¹⁴⁷ by doing so they signified that all who eat the one broken bread, Christ, enter into communion with him and form but one body in him.¹⁴⁸ The *Eucharistic assembly (synaxis)*, because the Eucharist is celebrated amid the assembly of the faithful, the visible expression of the Church.¹⁴⁹

<u>1330</u> The *memorial* of the Lord's Passion and Resurrection. The *Holy Sacrifice*, because it makes present the one sacrifice of Christ the Savior and includes the Church's offering. The terms *holy sacrifice of the Mass, "sacrifice of praise," spiritual sacrifice, pure and holy sacrifice* are also used, ¹⁵⁰ since it completes and surpasses all the sacrifices of the Old Covenant. The *Holy and Divine Liturgy*, because the Church's whole

Liturgy finds its center and most intense expression in the celebration of this sacrament; in the same sense we also call its celebration the Sacred Mysteries. We speak of the Most Blessed Sacrament because it is the Sacrament of sacraments. The Eucharistic species reserved in the tabernacle are designated by this same name.



<u>1331</u> Holy Communion, because by this sacra-

ment we unite ourselves to Christ, who makes us sharers in his Body and Blood to form a single body.¹⁵¹ We also call it: *the holy things* (*ta hagia; sancta*)¹⁵² - the first meaning of the phrase "communion of saints" in the Apostles' Creed - *the bread of angels, bread from heaven, medicine of immortality*,¹⁵³ *viaticum*.


<u>1332</u> *Holy Mass* (*Missa*), because the liturgy in which the mystery of salvation is accomplished concludes with the sending forth (*missio*) of the faithful, so that they may fulfill God's will in their daily lives.


