Notes from Fr. PJ

Dear Friends in Christ,

Peace!

It is like a trilogy, a three part-series on Prayer. I am referring to the Sunday Gospel readings we had two weeks ago, last week and this weekend.

Remember what we heard two weeks ago? Some of us might be thinking, I couldn't even remember what I had for breakfast yesterday, how can you expect me to remember the Gospel reading two weeks ago? You gotta be kidding. Well, kid you not. You're right. I couldn't even remember what I had for breakfast yesterday. I think it was some hot water, black in color, and there was some cream on it. I'm not sure.



Two Sundays ago, we learned about the Good Samaritan. "Go and do likewise," Jesus told the inquisitive scholar of the law. It was about faith/prayer shown in action. Then last Sunday, it was about Marth and Mary. It was about maintaining balance between contemplation and action. Jesus said that Mary did the better part because she listened to Him (and was therefore unburdened through her listening). This weekend, it is about prayer.

Jesus told his disciples how to pray and He assured them that not a single request goes unanswered. Of course, not all that we wish for or pray for will be granted from our own viewpoints and perspectives. What God wishes for us, wills for us and for our own good and salvation are prayers always answered. God does not respond in the way we expect.

May God's will be done, that should be primary to our prayer needs. Secondary is that we be given the strength and the courage to follow the will of God. This is where our faith in God is further deepened.

The last two parts of the presentation series that I will be doing this Wednesday and next week is about the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. The subtitle may be—"How we can get the most out of every Mass we attend." So, here's a preview and just be imaginative with me.

Mass starts with the letter "M." "M" has two points up, and three points down, its legs mainly. We'll separate "M" into five lines. The first line is upward, from man to God. Second line is downward, from God to man. Third line is upward, man to God again and last line is downward.

First line is upward—Entrance, I Confess, Glory and ends with Opening Prayer. Second line is God's response through the Readings—Old Testament, New Testament, Gospel. See that middle point? That's in the middle, the lowest point, and it's also where I will situate the homily. (I am just speaking for myself, though, not on behalf of the hardworking preachers and deacons we have.) Then, upwards again, Prayers of the Faithful, Offertory, Holy, Holy. The second point up is the Consecration—the highest point of the Mass, I believe. God becomes present and real in his creation—bread and wine—through faith, ushering forth a miracle and a mystery. All downhill after that.

The recessional of the priest and the ministers does not end with the last line of "M." Although some might leave after Communion to beat the Mass Rush (is there one?), M has a little curl on its third and last line. The Mass does not end in Church. It goes outward and forward, to our homes, our communities and our world. Those who have already left the Church at this time have already missed that little curl: the Final Blessing and the Sending Forth. Maybe they felt like the Levite or the priest two weeks ago, or Martha last week—places to go, people to see, things to do.

But, here it was or is and will be our eternal banquet—the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. It is the highest form of prayer. It is a homogeneous harmony of prayer, contemplation and action—a reminder of what the three Gospel Sunday readings were all about. It is my bread and butter, as a priest. It is our life, as brothers and sisters in Christ.

Keep well and be safe.

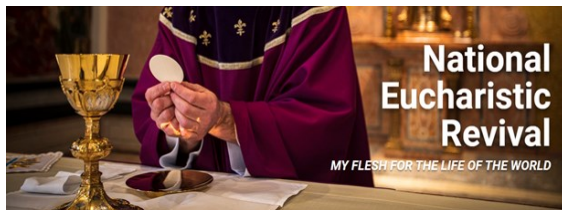

We are called to Sanctify

Why is the Eucharist so important for the Church today? The Lord Jesus, on the night before he suffered on the cross, shared one last meal with his disciples. During this meal our Savior instituted the sacrament of his Body and Blood. He did this in order to perpetuate the sacrifice of the Cross throughout the ages and to entrust to the Church a memorial of his death and resurrection. The Institution of the Eucharist is written down in the four Gospels Matthew 26:26-30, Mark 14:22-26, Luke 22:14-20, and John 6:22-59 (The Bread of Life Discourse). Jesus gives himself to us in the Eucharist as spiritual nourishment because he loves us. By eating the Body and drinking the Blood of Christ in the Eucharist, we become united to the person of Christ through his humanity. "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him" (Jn 6:56). In being united to the humanity of Christ, we are at the same time united to his divinity.
