

Notes from Fr. PJ

Dear Friends in Christ,

Happy 4th of July weekend!

This may be long reading material for you, but I do ask you to read it through.

It is about us being Americans. I am blessed and proud to be here in my adopted country. I was trained during the last four years of seminary formation here. My ordination to the priesthood decades ago came about because of the help, generosity and love of you, dear fellow Americans.

What does it mean to be an American?

Not too long ago, someone in a country that disliked us, published in a newspaper an offer of a reward to anyone who killed an American, any American. A dentist from Australia read the article and wrote the following to let everyone know what an American is,

"An American may be Apache, Seminole, Cree, or one of the many other Nations known as Native Americans. An American may also be English, or French, or Italian, Irish, German, Spanish, Polish, Russian, or Greek. Or perhaps he or she may be Mexican, Filipino, African, Indian, Chinese, Arab or Pakistani."

An American is Christian, or Jewish, Buddhist, or Muslim, or believe in the legends of their own culture. An American is also free to believe in no religion. An American is from the most prosperous land in the history of the world. The root of that prosperity can be found in the Declaration of Independence, which recognizes the God-given right of each person to the pursuit of happiness.

An American is generous. Americans have helped out just about every other nation of the world in their time of need. Americans welcome the best—the best products, the best books, the best music, the best food, the best athletes. But, they also welcome the least.

The national symbol of America, the Statue of Liberty, welcomes 'your tired and your poor, the wretched refuse of your teeming shores, the homeless, tempest tossed.' These in fact are the people who built America. So you can try to kill an American, if you must. Hitler did. So did Stalin and every blood-thirsty tyrant in the history of the modern world.

But, in doing so you would just be killing yourself because Americans are not a particular people from a particular place. They are the embodiment of the human spirit of freedom. Everyone who holds to that Spirit, everywhere, is, to that extent, an American."

Dear fellow Americans and friends in Christ Jesus, may we always be mindful of our freedom. Freedom comes from our God, who loves us continually and continuously. We need to invoke our loving God always for freedom to ring in our hearts, families and communities. I believe this is what Jesus had in mind when he sent the 72 disciples by pairs in this weekend's Gospel. They were to support each other, to be of use to each other, to carry the Good News. Freedom is like that—we exercise freedom best, we exercise our being Americans together, when we consider the other person, when we look to what will benefit all, rather than just one person.

July 4th. It is the day for us to rethink and remember. It is about who we are, what we believe and what we stand for. And while it is important for us to be identified and seen as Americans and as Roman Catholics, the greatest citizenship we have and the best identity we could ever present to others is that of being like Christ.

With Jesus the Christ, what greater identity could we possibly have?



Why is the Eucharist so important for the Church today?

Excerpts from Monitor article **Processions give public visibility to Eucharistic Revival's launch** by Emma Lee Italia, Contributing Editor 6/27/2022 11:42 AM

St. Veronica Parish, Howell, revived its Eucharistic Procession following a two-year pandemic hiatus, and deacons' homilies for the weekend focused particularly on the themes of respect and reverence for the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist, in light of the Eucharistic Revival.

"[It was] an occasion for rebirth and regeneration," said Father Peter J. Alindogan, St. Veronica pastor. "The Eucharistic Revival in our Diocese is not just timely but is essentially necessary in these present times."

He referenced the Pew Research poll that indicated as many as seven in 10 Catholics see the Eucharist as merely a symbol but not the actual Body and Blood of Christ, as well as his observation of the attitudes and manner of people's reception of the Eucharist.

To better prepare parishioners to receive the Eucharist, Father Alindogan encourages the extension of hours available for the Sacrament of Reconciliation in parishes. "I pray for an increase in numbers for the Sacrament of Penance," he emphasized. "We cannot receive the Eucharist worthily if we are plagued by mortal sin."

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is necessary before reception of the Eucharist. "The Revival ... is enveloped by both the interior and exterior values of our faith," Father Alindogan continued. "Faith is expressed more clearly in actions. Our faith in our Blessed Lord is expressed more vividly in the way we celebrate, partake and respect the Body of Christ."







Back-to-School Sales Tax Holiday for NJ Residents

Historic Back-to-School Sales Tax Holiday from August 27 through September 5 will give parents and students a break on learning supplies.

The following supplies and equipment will be exempt from August 27 to September 5:

- ♦ **School supplies**, such as pens and pencils, notebooks, and binders
- ♦ **School art supplies**, including paints and paint-brushes, clay, and glazes
- ♦ **School instructional materials**, such as reference books, reference maps, globes, textbooks, and workbooks
- ♦ **Computers**
