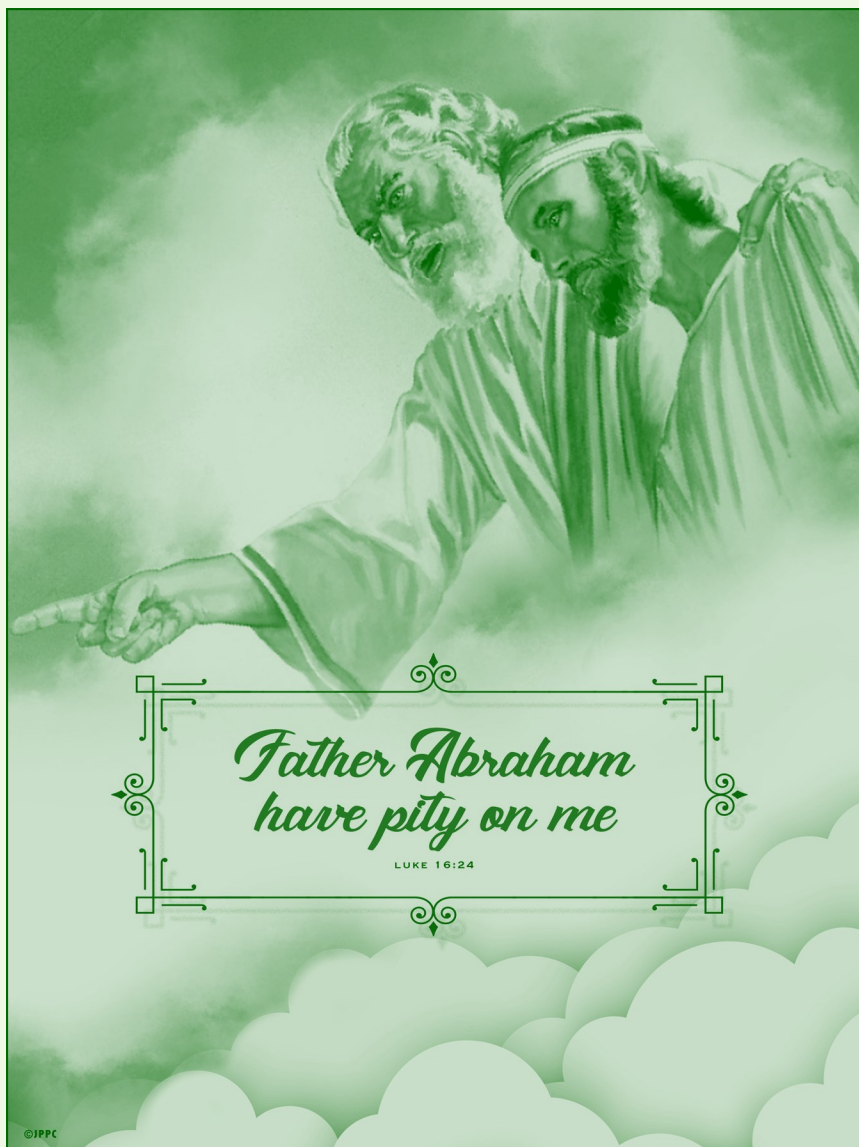

Notes from Fr. PJ

Dear Friends in Christ,

Peace!

The parable that we heard from our Gospel reading this weekend should make us pause, and reflect on a lot of things.

First, who are the person/s we have ignored or been ignoring for quite a time now? Who are the Lazaruses of our lives?



The rich man never really hurt Lazarus. He did not hate him. He did not betray him, or abuse him. He simply ignored him. He did not do anything for Lazarus.

Apathy, blindness, absence, neglect, indifference - in a way, these are the things that could create a chasm between and among us. It is how we close our eyes on those who are suffering. It is how we close our hearts on those who need our attention and love.

Some of the most serious offenses we have against God are those offenses we have done against others. And most of the serious offenses we have done against others are not what we did to them, but what we did not do.

The rich man failed to see the needs of Lazarus because he was occupied with so many things. He might have been so distracted from his work that he did not see what was happening around him. Leaving for work in the morning, he was given the opportunity to notice him right at his doorsteps. Coming home from work in the evening, he was again given the moment and the chance to help him. But, he was too occupied with so many things.

And sad to say, that could happen to most of us. Things to do, people to see, places to go – that we forget, we do not know, or ever ask, whether we could be of help to someone like Lazarus.

I wonder what could have happened if the rich man was given another chance, if God had sent him back for another 10 years of life, or even just for a year? How would he have changed? Would he have simply added one selfless act to his daily agenda? Would he have noticed the needs of the persons around him? Would he have a new perspective that would change the whole direction of his life?

We are all given the second (or more) chance to change our lives for the better, to serve Christ and our neighbor. We are all given the second (or more) chance to notice, to care for and to be a brother or a sister to someone in need. Hope we don't lose the chance/s.

The rich man was denied his plea for Lazarus to just “dip the tip of his finger in water and cool” his tongue. He suffered torment in flames. Again, why was he in torment? Because he did not do anything to help Lazarus, who was in need. That was a sin of omission.

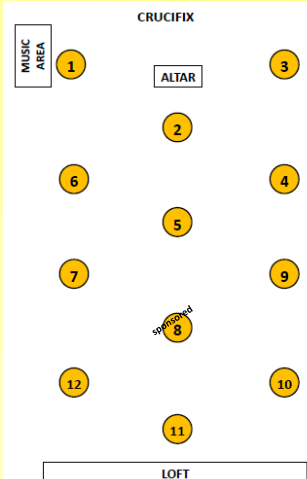


LED by the Light

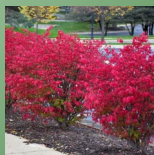

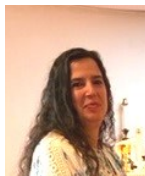
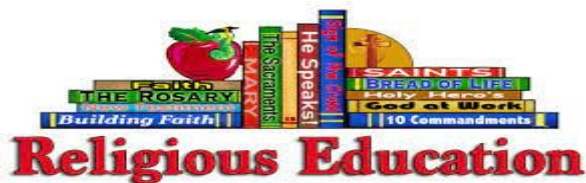

meeting in the Parish Hall.

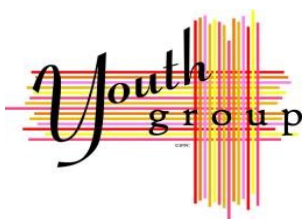

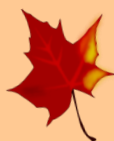

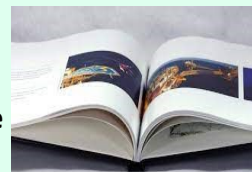

The **40 Days for Life**, Sept 28 to Nov 6, is a campaign of prayer and fasting for an end to abortion here in America. Since its inception in 2007, 22,013 babies have been saved, 242 abortion workers have quit, and 120 abortion centers have closed.

40 Days for Life also involves prayerful, peaceful witnessing in front of an abortion clinic. People say the Rosary or other prayers for one hour while walking along the sidewalk. Monmouth's site is Planned Parenthood, 69 E. Newman Springs Rd, Shrewsbury.
