What is the Parish Pastoral Council?

The **Parish Assembly** on October 12th will culminate in the creation of a mission statement for Saint Veronica's.

Since Saint Veronica's establishment in 1962 by the Most Reverend George W Ahr of the Diocese of Trenton, our Parish has been united in a common destiny to bring the immaculate light of our Lord Jesus Christ to the dark and sinful world around us by acting as an embassy/house of God's heavenly kingdom on earth. The flame of the Holy Spirit is within our Church, but it shines, and dims based on the faith of its parishioners. Saint Veronica's Parish is steadfastly working to recover from years of spiritual decline. (Whether based on factors within the Church or the spiritually hostile world around us.) For the past, several years Mass attendance has been either stagnating or declining and we are still feeling the effects of the Covid 19 pandemic lock down.

Saint Veronica's changed greatly in its community and Church life in its short existence, it was only 6 decades ago when Fr Mitchell J. Cetkowski was appointed our first pastor. Nevertheless, we must continue to hold dearly our initial roots as a young and ambitious parish, continuing to march forward no matter the obstacles. We are now reaching a point where this current period of uncertainty in the future growth of our parish will end. The outcome of the Parish Assembly and the new Mission Statement for the Church will mark a new era, formed from a solid foundation, for our parish and flourishing community!

George W Ahr was the reigning Bishop of Trenton from 1950 to 1979 and oversaw a Catholic population increase of 300,000 to 800,000, more than a 2x population growth. Our Parish was established for that reason and by looking back at history we can see that magnificent victories in the name of God are not

impossible and can happen again. Today, we are presented with the same problem as he was, in a different form. To manage and facilitate a 2x parishioner growth. This would be the amount of people needed to return the Parish back to pre-covid levels.
